A Message from the President...

Licking Memorial Health Systems' (LMHS) mission to improve the health of the community is the foundation for the services we offer and the support we give to local organizations. LMHS provides quality healthcare services for Licking County residents at Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH), three Urgent Care locations, numerous family practice and specialty offices, clinics, and physical therapy and wellness facilities. In addition to healthcare services, LMHS hosts events, educational programs and activities that promote healthy lifestyles and offer valuable resources.

In 2019, LMHS once again completed a major expansion project. The addition to the Licking Memorial Medical Campus, located at 1717 West Main Street in Newark, mirrors the original design of the building and is the new location for our Dermatology, Gastroenterology and Gynecology practices. A larger area also was created for the Wellness Center and Rehabilitation Services. With the additional space, the Wellness Center can offer more equipment and allow more residents to participate in the Wellness Exercise Program, which is available via physician referral at no cost to individuals, aged 60 or above, with a chronic health concern or a severe weight problem. Participants are monitored by Licking Memorial Community Case Management team members and also may speak with a dietitian, registered nurse, personal trainer, pharmacist or social worker to discuss wellness needs.

Also new in 2019, the LMH Development Council hosted three resource fairs to provide information on topics important to community health and wellbeing. The first event, Caring for Aging Parents – A Resource Fair, was held in August. Approximately 350 people attended the event to gather information from area vendors about the resources available for seniors. Information booths, which filled the LMH First Floor Conference Rooms and the John and Mary Alford Pavilion, included care facilities, healthcare information and information on healthy living.

In September, expectant mothers, fathers-to-be and grandparents were able to browse information displays at the first Preparing for Baby – A Resource Fair, and in November, grandparents caring for their grandchildren were invited to visit the Kinship Care – A Resource Fair for Grandparents Raising Grandchildren event. The intention of all three events was to offer a single location where Licking County residents could find the assistance they need to care for their family members.

In addition to the new events, LMHS continues to offer many programs free of charge that provide education and other tools to help patients understand how to care for their bodies and various health conditions. Participation in the Active•Fit and Active•Senior programs has increased greatly over the past year. The programs promote healthy lifestyles for children, ages 6 to 12, and adults, ages 60 and older, through various goals which are documented online. We also provide financial support and other resources to hundreds of local organizations for programs that encourage residents to make positive changes for better long-term health. LMHS has more than 2,000 employees who are dedicated to the residents of Licking County. We offer and support programs that educate and encourage healthy lifestyles because we are keenly aware that our patients also are our family, friends and neighbors. LMHS Focuses on Community Healt

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is dedicated to Licking County residents and strives to improve the health of the community by offering top quality health care, medical specialists, physicians, staff and facilities. Beyond the care provided, LMHS fosters prevention and well-being by offering or supporting community programs, activities, clinics, personal home visits, and resources aimed at encouraging healthy choices. LMHS continues to expand throughout the county, and most recently in Downtown Newark, in order to reach as many residents as possible.

Additional medical services were added at the Gerald K. McClain Building in Downtown Newark during 2019. A Women's Health practice and Laboratory Services now are available for the convenience of those living in the area who may not be able to travel far for care. These services are in addition to the Urgent Care and Family Practice located in the building. LMHS also has been working to provide more services through the For Your Health Center at Washington Square. Residents can visit with a registered nurse, tobacco cessation counselor, social worker, dietitian or personal trainer. LMHS began offering wellness services at the Harbor Community Center located in Buckeye Lake in 2019. A registered nurse is available every Tuesday and Thursday to perform a variety of health services,

including wellness and medication education. Providing these services assists in proactively reducing the incidence of illness and injury in the community.

LMHS continues to expand resources available to the community. This year, the flu vaccine initiative, Be Wise...Immunize, was offered at two locations – Licking Memorial Family Practice – Downtown Newark and Licking Memorial Pediatrics – Pataskala. More than 400 infants and youth, up to age 18, received the flu immunization at no cost. The annual increase of participants and the need for event expansion demonstrates that local families are well-informed about the potential impact of the seasonal flu and want to safeguard their children's health.

The LMHS Sports Screening Program also expanded to the Pataskala Health Campus in 2019 providing pre-participation physical examinations, electrocardiogram (EKG) and echocardiogram heart screenings, and ImPACT baseline concussion testing to Licking County student-athletes entering grades 7 through 12, and students from C-TEC's Criminal Justice, Fire and Physical Therapy programs. A total of 469 students from 15 Licking County Schools participated in the program.

There also has been an increase in families utilizing the Fruit and Vegetable Prescription (FVRx) program. Families who qualify can receive a physician prescription to receive fruit and vegetables from the Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Café or tokens to purchase such from the Canal Market District in Downtown Newark during the summer. Another valuable resource being offered to the community is LMH Ride. Lack of transportation is a real barrier to good health care. Now, individuals who qualify can

be picked up at their home and transported to medical appointments.

Education is a valuable tool in assisting community members to make healthy choices. LMHS continues to offer educational programs on numerous topics to assist residents in understanding different disorders or health-related issues. This year's classes included:

- Dining with Diabetes
- Healthier for Life
- Living Well with Hearing Loss
- Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease
- Adventures in Plant-based Eating
- Defeating Cancer: An Educational Dinner Event

Presentations about the given topic are offered at the classes as well as a question and answer session. These events are vital to assisting community members in making informed decisions about their own care.

LMHS continues to offer numerous programs and activities throughout the year to encourage community members to be active and connect with others. This year, LMHS offered a joint bowling event for youth and mature adults who participate in the Active•Fit and Active•Senior programs. Children, ages 6 through 12, bowled alongside seniors ages 60 or over. The event provided an opportunity for the two groups to spend time together – a great opportunity for youth and their grandparents to connect.

Improving the health of the community means offering resources and opportunities for residents to take control of their lifestyle and healthcare choices. LMHS provides as many activities and programs as possible and also supports other organizations that do the same. LMHS and its employees donate time and resources to

Changes, Enhancements an

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) continually acquires the best modern medical advances to improve healthcare experiences and outcomes for patients. Changes may be subtle and take place without public awareness. Enhancements and modifications at LMHS over the past year include:

EKOS Therapy

The Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Cardiology Department obtained new technology to help dissolve pulmonary embolisms. EKOS Therapy is a two-part clot-dissolving process. A catheter is inserted into the pulmonary artery by a trained physician to administer a clot-dissolving medicine called a thrombolytic. The therapy also employs the use of ultrasound energy to allow the medicine to penetrate the clot. Because the catheter is placed directly into the pulmonary artery and works with the ultrasound to dissolve the PE, the thrombolytic is utilized in a lower dose, which decreases the

EKOS Therapy

Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS) Program

LMH implemented the Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS) program, which combines simple evidence-based interventions aimed at improving post-operative recovery for patients undergoing major surgery. The ERAS program focuses on education, nutritional management, lifestyle changes to decrease smoking and alcohol intake, and utilizing alternate pain management strategies to minimize opioid use. ERAS utilizes recommended protocols for surgical procedures to create optimal outcomes for patients. These protocols are enacted when the surgeon or physician determines the need for surgery. The physician provides the patient with crucial pre-operative instructions that include the importance of tobacco and alcohol cessation, exercise, and consuming nutritious foods that will help boost the immune system. Additional protocols are completed during a preadmission testing clinic visit before the surgery date. These protocols help determine the best plan for the patient.

VersaCare Monitor System

VersaCare features an integrated program that collects data on a patient's heart rate and oxygen saturation in the blood during exercises used to assist in the patient's rehabilitation. The data can be linked to the patient's electronic health record and can be used to create a daily report to graph progress and trends. Staff members are able to spend face-to-face time with the patient gathering more personal feedback, such as how the patient is feeling, if they are experiencing pain, and if the intensity of exercise is appropriate. This

one-on-one interaction is beneficial in offering the most specialized and individualized care for each patient while building trust between the staff and patient.

Medical Campus Expansion

The Medical Campus addition mirrors the original design of the building and serves as the new location for Physical, Occupational and Speech Therapy services. Licking Memorial Dermatology, Gastroenterology and Gynecology physician offices, as well as a Wellness Center, also are located in the expanded facility. The completed building is more than 66,000 square feet and employs 80 to 85 staff. In addition, an extended parking area and access road from Terrace Avenue are available.

New Testing for Cardiac Patients

LMH became the first facility in the nation to implement high-sensitivity cardiac troponin testing. Troponins are a group of proteins found in skeletal and heart (cardiac) muscle fibers that regulate muscular contraction. Troponin tests measure the level of cardiac-specific troponin in the blood to help detect heart injury. Detection of an elevated cardiac troponin is defined as a myocardial injury. The injury is considered acute if there is a rise and/or fall of cardiac troponin values. The high-sensitivity results are available considerably faster, allowing physicians to make a more prompt diagnosis for possible cardiac patients. Within three hours, physicians can determine if a patient needs to be admitted for further cardiac care or can be discharged safely. Previously, eight hours were necessary to make this determination. Hospital admissions also are reduced as patients are not admitted unnecessarily before the final results are available. With patients moved to the appropriate areas for care more quickly, Emergency Department (ED) beds are available for additional patients, decreasing the overall turnaround time for all ED patients.

Many community members have shared their appreciation for having access to outstanding healthcare resources available locally.



Jerry McClain - Heart Care "I was driving on State Route 16 to return to my office at The Jerry McClain Companies from a lunch meeting when I experienced severe pain in my stomach and chest. I recall thinking that I had never felt worse in my entire life. When I reached the lobby, I collapsed into a chair near the entrance and passed out. I briefly remember being placed on a gurney, then I woke up in the Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Emergency Department (ED). A mere 27 minutes after my arrival, and 45 minutes after EMS arrived at my office, an angioplasty was performed to reopen a blocked artery with a balloon and two stents. We are so blessed to have the care I received available in our community. Hassan Rajjoub, M.D., saved my life, and I would not be here today without him. Now, I am back to doing all the things I love, even if it is at a slightly slower pace."

Sharon Sinsabaugh - Stroke Care "One morning in October 2018, my left arm and hand went completely numb. It seemed odd, so I started to talk aloud to myself and realized my speech was extremely slurred. Fortunately, my husband was home at the time and also recognized the severity of my speech impairment, so we immediately sought care at the LMH ED. Much to my relief, a magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scan showed I had not suffered any permanent damage. I was admitted to the Hospital for further observation and was informed I had experienced a transient ischemic attack (TIA). Brandon Chandos, M.D., of Licking Memorial Neurology, evaluated me the next morning. Due to my history of migraines, he suggested that I have an echocardiogram to determine if there was a defect in my heart that could be putting me at risk for stroke. Dr. Chandos' intuition regarding my chronic migraines and the connection to the possible heart defect was lifechanging."



Evan Gentry – Respiratory Care

"After I got married, I started to think about the future, having children and wanting to be there for them. I finally understood the health risks associated with my habit of using smokeless tobacco and wanted to make a change. I met a Quit for Your Health program counselor in the spring of 2018. He was extremely supportive and stressed that in order to be successful, I needed to initiate the process and move forward at my own pace. My counselor recommended a variety of techniques to deal with cravings. Taking a walk when having a craving proved to be a successful distraction. By mid-October, I had kicked my habit. When several days had passed without a craving or tobacco even crossing my mind, I knew I had made it. Moving forward, my counselor reassured me that I could depend on him for assistance as necessary."



Patty Carpenter - Diabetes Care "I began seeing Kevin Graham, M.D., of Licking Memorial Family Practice – Granville, in 2018 after I was diagnosed with type 2 diabetes. Dr. Graham recommended that I attend the Diabetes Education classes offered by LMH. I am so appreciative of Dr. Graham for his care. He set me on the right track to manage my diabetes and it has really turned my life around. I learned so much through the Diabetes Education classes. Dietitian Annmarie Thacker. M.S., R.D., L.D., C.D.C.E.S., always is so encouraging and makes me feel good upon walking into the office. She knows just how to answer my questions. She guides me to eat well, enjoy foods I like within reason, and consume appropriate portion sizes. I also visit the Wellness Center three times a week now. I really enjoy exercising at the facility. I have met many good friends there. You can tell that everyone really cares for you. The staff has such a good understanding of their patients, their capabilities and the equipment. The open relationship we have is comforting and I know that they are there to help if I need it."



Mark Mitchell, M.D. - Surgery Care

"In May, just days before I was scheduled to receive a kidney transplant, I developed a case of diverticulitis – inflammation or infection of small pouches called diverticula that develop in the walls of the intestines. The transplant had to be postponed, and it was recommended that I take action to remove the diverticula to prevent the condition from recurring. To receive the kidney transplant, I would be required to take an immunosuppressant – a medication that inhibits or prevents activity of the immune system in order to lower the body's ability to reject the transplanted organ. If diverticulitis reoccurred while I was taking the medication, I would be at a much higher risk of emergency surgery, complications or possibly even death. I contacted Victor F. Ferrini, M.D., of Licking Memorial Surgical Services, to discuss treatment options. Dr. Ferrini and I had a great discussion about whether or not bowel resection should be considered. I was very impressed that he did his research about surgery on persons on immunosuppressants. In the end, we decided surgery would

be the best option. Everyone, from registration to the pre-operation staff, was so supportive and friendly from the moment I checked in for surgery. I spent five days at LMH following the procedure and was treated with the utmost respect and kindness. I was impressed with the quality of care I received and the cheerful attitudes of the staff members who responded to

my needs."



Noah Blake - Pediatric Care

Kiera Harper, mother of 14-year-old Noah Blake, shared, "Due to Noah's age and upcoming participation in high school sports, this was the first year that an electrocardiogram (EKG) was performed as part of the annual well-child visit. His physician recognized an abnormality in Noah's heart during the procedure, and he was later diagnosed with Wolff-Parkinson White Syndrome. This was not something we were expecting at all. Since the fourth grade, sports have always been a big part of his life. Noah plays football, wrestles and runs track, and assists his father with lawn care, including mowing, weeding and mulching. At first, he was nervous wondering if he would be able to play sports again, but he is now on his way to recovery. I have always felt it was very important to stay current with the annual well-child visits for all my children. Licking Memorial Pediatrics staff is fantastic! They are very familyfriendly and always very helpful in working me into the schedule when one of my children is ill."

Corporate Breakfasts

The Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Council hosted four Corporate Breakfasts in 2019 to inform community leaders about LMHS' services and technology advances. The topics included a recap of 2018 at LMHS, the newly implemented nurse call light system, the importance of immunizations, and the dangers of vaping.



The Heart Truth: A Red Dress Event

LMHS celebrated women's heart health with The Heart Truth: A Red Dress Event on February 7 with guest speaker Nina M. Hourmouzis, M.D., of Licking Memorial Internal Medicine. Residents of Licking County were invited to this annual event in collaboration with the American Heart Association's "Go Red for Women Day," which was celebrated nationally on February 1. This event encourages women to make heart-healthy lifestyle choices. The red dress has become a national symbol to increase awareness of women's heart health.

Volunteer and TWIGS Recognition Dinner

LMH hosted the annual Volunteer Recognition Dinner on April 9 and the TWIGS Recognition Dinner on April 29 to show gratitude to the individuals who regularly devote their time to benefit the Hospital. In 2019, LMH volunteers processed nearly 123,000 items through special projects, made approximately 13,000 appointment confirmation telephone calls, delivered almost 53,000 newspapers, and assisted more than 11,000 patients and visitors by escorting them to their destination or by providing other assistance at the main Hospital and the clinics located at LMH – Tamarack and 1717 West Main Street. Volunteers also assisted with more than 2,500 messenger runs to various departments, delivered more than 750 web cards and flowers, and completed almost 4,400 Oncology Lab runs. Also in 2019, TWIGS donated \$147,998 to the Licking Memorial Health Foundation (LMHF), increasing their 70-year contribution total to more than \$5.6 million.

LMHS President & CEO Rob Montagnese welcomed more than 200 guests, which included survivors and their families, caregivers and friends. Participants gathered on the Hospital Front Lawn to celebrate all cancer survivors for facing each day with courage, dignity, and serving as an inspiration to their community. LMHS Summer Camps

Employment

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) has provided employment opportunities for Licking County residents for more than 122 years. LMHS is the primary healthcare provider in Licking County and has an established reputation as the community's leading healthcare provider. This distinction is largely due to the dedication of LMHS' 2,000-plus employees who serve diligently to improve the health of the community.

LMHS has high standards for its employees and believes in recognizing and rewarding their accomplishments through various celebrations, including monthly Dining with the Stars recognition breakfasts and luncheons, bimonthly employee birthday events, and annual recognition events, as well as daily on-the-spot and peer recognition programs. LMHS also offers a comprehensive benefits package that includes a retirement savings plan with a generous employer contribution, tuition assistance, free uniforms and free access to a new employee wellness center, as well as excellent health, dental and vision insurance.

121 Years of Caring at LMHS

In January 2019, employees celebrated 121 years of providing quality health care to the community with a donation-themed celebration. Divided into interdepartmental teams, a friendly competition occurred to determine which groups could donate the largest quantity of cold weather items in pounds, and the most monetary donations. After all items were weighed, contributions equaled 187.3 pounds of cold weather items (outerwear, blankets, etc.), while monetary donations reached \$10,669.36. The collected goods were donated to the Center for New Beginnings and The Salvation Army of Licking County to help needy individuals and families of Licking County stay warm during the cold winter months.

National Doctors' Day

National Doctors' Day provides the opportunity to honor physicians throughout the U.S. each year who guide and treat patients to positively impact their health. During the month of March, LMHS celebrates the LMH Active Medical Staff and their dedicated service. Fundraising

Charitable donations help Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) proactively respond to the growing healthcare needs of the community through the incorporation of the latest technological advances. To generate funds for equipment purchases, capital expenses and facility improvements, the Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Department works diligently to raise contributions to Licking Memorial Health Foundation (LMHF). The contributions provide capital for projects and programs that may otherwise go unfunded and are not used for salaries or general operating expenses.

In 2019, LMHF supported the expansion project at the Licking Memorial Medical Campus, located at 1717 West Main Street in Newark. The 32,210 square-foot addition to the medical building serves as the new location for Physical, Occupational and Speech Therapy services, Dermatology, Gastroenterology and Gynecology physician offices, and an expanded Wellness Center. In addition, an increased parking area and an access road from Terrace Avenue were included in the project.

Community Cornerstone Club - The

Community Cornerstone Club is comprised of individuals and businesses who contribute \$100 or more to LMHF. In 2019, the Cornerstone Club had 186 members who raised \$39,895 toward the Licking Memorial Medical Campus expansion. Donors receive a Main Street Collection recognition piece at each \$500 milestone of giving. The 2019 addition to the Main Street Collection, a replica of Licking Memorial Urgent Care – Granville, recognized donors who have reached the \$10,500 level of giving.



Paving Our Future Commemorative Bricks


- The LMH Development Council offers a distinctive way to recognize family members,
