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### A Message from the President ...

In 2011, Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) continued to receive prestigious awards that illustrate the high quality of health care that we provide. The awards reinforce the truth that Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH), a 227-bed community hospital, provides care that equals, and often surpasses, care provided by hospitals in larger cities. At LMH, patients find the warmth and attention of a community hospital, combined with cutting-edge technology that many metropolitan hospitals have not yet adopted.

The new CellaVision® system in the LMH Laboratory helps medical technologists examine cells in patients' blood samples. CellaVision sorts and projects images of blood components, 100 at a time, onto a computer screen so that the medical technologists can evaluate them more easily.

LMH invested in an RF Surgical Detection System in 2011 to enhance patient safety in the Operating Room. Although the surgical teams already had a thorough procedure to avoid human error, the new technology tracks surgical sponges by implanting them with tiny radio frequency tags. Before each patient's surgery is completed, a simple check will indicate if any sponges are still in place. LMH is among the first 100 U.S. hospitals to embrace this new technology.

Oncology patients are discovering that the updates and services at LMH can help ease their cancer experience. The newly renovated Oncology Clinic on the fifth floor includes comfortable waiting area furnishings that were made possible by a generous contribution from Jim and Amy Matesich. The area features the 450-gallon, L-shaped saltwater Rod Callander Memorial Aquarium, which was named after Amy's father. In addition, cancer patients can now find specialty products they need, such as wigs and skin creams, at LMH. On LMH's first floor, a cancer supply shop recently opened in response to

patients' requests. The Beautiful You Boutique is owned by cancer survivor Katie Leibas, who donates the non-profit store's proceeds to the LMH Oncology Clinic.

LMH also responded to suggestions by Licking County's emergency medical technicians to purchase the innovative therapeutic hypothermia technology to improve the survival rate and long-range outcome of cardiac arrest patients. The Arctic Sun® uses closed circulation, water-filled pads to reduce the patient's body temperature in a controlled manner to minimize heart tissue damage.

The Community Education program at LMH has expanded to meet the community's growing interest in learning about health and wellness. Additional informal afternoon classes have been scheduled in LMH's Betsy Eaton O'Neill Health Resource Center and new evening sessions will take place in the Hospital's First Floor Conference Rooms. The classes are free of charge, and information is available online at www.LMHealth.org.

LMHS' 1,600-plus employees are enthusiastic about the opportunity to provide the highest level of skills, knowledge and technology to our patients, family, friends and neighbors. This *Annual Report 2011* reviews LMHS' activities throughout the year and summarizes the scope of our endeavors as we continue to "improve the health of the community."

On behalf of LMHS, I thank the Licking County community for trusting us with your health care needs. Your confidence in the Health Systems allows us to continue to provide the highest level of care, remain at the forefront of advanced technologies and offer new convenient services to the community.

### Oncology Services Enhanced at LMH

In the highly advanced field of oncology, physicians are now able to successfully treat many forms of cancer that were debilitating or even deadly just a generation ago. However, Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) understands that cancer patients need more than technology to lead them through the battle of their lives. The entire Oncology staff is dedicated to encouraging patients, making them as comfortable as possible and providing education to improve their health. Over the past year, LMH launched a \$1.5 million project to renovate the Hematology/ Oncology Department on the fifth floor to make the environment a more uplifting component of the healing process.

### **Rod Callander Memorial Aquarium**

The newly remodeled Hematology/Oncology Department features a more spacious, upscale registration and waiting area, private chemotherapy infusion rooms, additional exam rooms, an updated chemotherapy mixing room, and a centrally located staff office. The focal point of the waiting area, a custom-made, L-shaped, 450-gallon saltwater aquarium with floor-to-ceiling Pennsylvania maple cabinetry, was made possible by a generous donation from Jim and Amy Matesich in memory of her father, Rod Callander. A dedication event is planned for the spring of 2012.

### **Community Fundraising Activities**

Undesignated donations to the Licking Memorial Health Foundation from community members in 2011 were applied toward the Hematology/Oncology Renovation Project. In addition, community members made contributions to support the renovations through several projects: sales of the Ultra Sounds jazz band CDs, Community Cornerstone, Community Shred Day donations, Twentieth Century Club, the Zonta Champagne Luncheon and Fashion Show, TWIGS, and the LMH Golf Gala.



### **Cancer Survivors' Picnic**

LMH hosted the first annual Cancer Survivors' Picnic on June 12, 2011, to support patients who have completed treatment, or are still receiving services. More than 200 cancer patients and their family members attended the outdoor barbecue on the Hospital's front lawn.

### **Cancer Survivor's Inspirational Tale**

Sean Swarner, a two-time cancer survivor and motivational speaker who is originally from Willard, Ohio, presented his inspirational story at two LMHS sponsored events. Sean was first diagnosed with advanced stage IV Hodgkin's disease when he was just 13 years old. He beat the odds by surviving the cancer, but then was discovered to have a rare and malignant Askin tumor in his chest wall at the age of 16. LMH hosted a reception for the community to learn about Sean's inspirational achievement as the first cancer survivor to climb Mount Everest, the highest peak on Earth. Sean's message to cancer patients is to remain positive and to continue living life to the fullest. He declared, "Cancer is a word, not a sentence."

After Sean climbed Mount Everest, he achieved another goal to become the first cancer survivor to climb the highest peak on each of the seven continents, and is working toward becoming the first cancer survivor to trek to both the North and South poles. Sean also shared his story with nearly 700 community leaders as LMHS sponsored the Licking County Chamber of Commerce's annual Groundhog Breakfast.

### **New Hematologist/Oncologist**







## Changes, Enhancements and Technology

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is constantly advancing to keep abreast of medical advances and to improve the healthcare experience for patients and visitors. In many instances, the changes are subtle and take place without the public's awareness. Changes and improvements at LMHS over the past year include:

**Otolaryngology Surgery Technologies -** U.S. News & World Report named LMH as a Best Regional Hospital in the Columbus Metro Area for 2011. The award rated LMH with impressive scores in patient safety and patient services, but it was the Hospital's performance in ear, nose and throat (ENT) procedures that propelled LMH into the forefront of the 22 hospitals in the Columbus metropolitan area. A large part of LMH's excellence with ENT procedures is due to the Hospital's investment in technology that improves patient safety and recovery time.

- The Medtronic Fusion Navigation System™ is an electromagnetic, image-guided system that helps surgeons pinpoint the precise location of surgical instruments inside the sinus cavity. The Fusion Navigation System utilizes technology that is similar to a GPS (global positioning system), and allows the surgery to be performed under general anesthesia in a less invasive manner while its high-tech images provide clear and detailed guidance.
- Balloon Sinuplasty™ Technology by Acclarent is used for patients with chronic sinusitis who do not respond to medication. The small sinus balloon is inserted into the nose while the patient is under general anesthesia. The balloon is inflated to expand the sinus cavity and allow it to drain without cutting any tissue. This technology reduces the risk of bleeding, preserves normal tissue and provides a shorter, more pleasant recovery for the patient.

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• The Starion Medical Entcep "Tissue Welding" Technology is a new tonsil removing technique at LMH that uses thermal energy delivered through special forceps to remove and seal the tonsils. Surrounding tissue is unaffected, so there is less pain and bleeding than with traditional methods of tonsillectomy.

**AFX™ Endovascular AAA System -** In 2011, LMH became the first Hospital in Central Ohio, and one of the first in the nation, to implant the new Endologix AFX<sup>™</sup> Endovascular AAA System, a minimally invasive stent technology that was approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for the treatment of abdominal aortic aneurysms (AAA). The procedure was performed on August 15 – just one day after the AFX system was released to hospitals nationwide. The AFX<sup>™</sup> Endovascular AAA System, manufactured by Endologix, Inc., utilizes an anatomical fixation (AFX) technology in conjunction with a new low profile, highly precise delivery system and stent graft material known as STRATA™, which support the stent in the artery without relying on high radial force or barbs to secure to the aneurysm. This makes the stent less prone to dislodge and reduces the risk of endoleaks, which occur when blood leaks between the stent and the artery and allows the aneurysm to continue growing, requiring additional surgeries. The AFX System is the smallest on the market and can be delivered percutaneously with a small, single incision. This implantation technique offers a significantly lower risk than traditional, open surgery, and is associated with less blood loss, shorter hospital stays and a faster recovery.

Second Generation AngioJet® Technology - At LMH, a high-tech method called AngioJet® is utilized to treat deep vein thrombosis (DVT), a painful condition where blood clots form, usually in the veins of the legs, or possibly in the arms, and restrict blood out-flow to the affected limb, causing swelling. In 2011, LMH invested in a new, second generation AngioJet machine with more capabilities to replace the previous model. With the AngioJet mechanical thrombectomy system, the interventional radiologist or vascular surgeon inserts a thin, flexible catheter with ultrasound guidance into the vein that is obstructed by the blood clot. High-speed water jets create a vacuum to pull the clot into the catheter, where it is then pulverized and vacuumed out of the vein. During the procedure, an inferior vena caval filter is placed past the clot to ensure no blood clots travel to the lungs. The AngioJet also uses a "pulse spray" to deliver "clot buster" TPA (tissue plasminogen activator) medication into the clot to rapidly dissolve it. AngioJet can also be used in an artery to remove blood clots similar to blood clot removal in the veins.





Licking Memorial Pediatrics - Newark Sick/Well Child Renovations -

The Tamarack Road office of Licking Memorial Pediatrics – Newark completed renovations to reduce the risk of children contracting illnesses while waiting for their well child appointments. With the new renovations, the office now has two entrances to separate waiting areas – one for well child visits, and the other for sick child visits. The two separate waiting areas are designed to prevent well infants and children from coming into close contact with others who are sick. Parents are instructed what entrance and waiting area to use when they call to schedule an appointment.

Hematology/Oncology Department Renovation - In 2011, Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) began a \$1.5 million Hematology/Oncology Department Renovation. The newly remodeled LMH Hematology/Oncology Department will feature a larger, upscale registration and waiting area, upgraded private chemotherapy infusion rooms, additional exam rooms, an updated chemotherapy mixing room and a centrally located staff office. The renovation project is designed to expand the existing areas and to better serve the patients and physicians by utilizing space more efficiently and effectively, as well as creating a soothing, stress-free environment.

**C-TEC Wellness Center -** In an endeavor to make wellness services more accessible to the community, LMH opened a second Wellness Center at C-TEC (Career and Technology Education Center) on Price Road in Newark. The new Wellness Center includes treadmills, ellipticals, stationary bikes, recumbent cross trainer equipment and a certified fitness trainer to supervise activities. Additional features of the Wellness Center at C-TEC include exercise classes, nutrition education, tobacco cessation counseling, health screenings and health education programs. Hours of operation for the Wellness Center at C-TEC are 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The new facility is open to C-TEC students and staff, and other members of the community upon registration.

**New Neurology Practice** – Neurology is the most recent specialty added to the Licking Memorial Health Professionals, a group of healthcare practices with more than 100 medical professionals dedicated to improving the health of the community. Neurology is a specialty that focuses on medical problems affecting the nervous system. The new practice, staffed by Linquan Sun, M.D., is located in the Moundbuilders Doctors' Park, Building 2, at 1272 West Main Street in Newark.

**Expanded Pre-participation Sports Screenings** – A record number of Licking County students participated in the free Heart to Place pre-participation screenings offered by LMHS in 2011. From May to July, 1,267 students received physical exams, which is a 36 percent increase over 2010. The screenings, now in their sixth year, have expanded to include ImPACT (Immediate Post-concussion Assessment and Cognitive Testing) baseline concussion screenings, in addition to electrocardiogram (ECG) testing for junior high and high school students. Band members, Licking County All-Stars football players and students in C-TEC's Criminal Justice, Fire and Physical Therapy programs are eligible, as well.

Major Gifts Fundraising Committee - In 2011, the Licking Memorial Health Foundation (LMHF), a nonprofit corporation established in 1984 to support LMHS through fundraising activities, formed the Major Gifts Committee to promote charitable giving. Two local community leaders, Jim and Amy Matesich, are chairing this important committee. The new Major Gifts Committee is comprised of dynamic community leaders who have a history of supporting LMHS, including Glenn Abel, Tom Cummiskey, Patrick Guanciale, Donald Hill, John Hinderer, Shari Hively, Pat Jeffries, Amy Matesich, Jim Matesich, Jerry McClain, Mary Jane McDonald, Bob McGaughy, T. Thomas Mills, M.D., Robert O'Neill and Russ Suskind. Jim and Amy kicked off the Major Gifts Committee's efforts with a Founder Level gift of \$100,000 over 10 years. The contribution will be used to provide a memorial aquarium feature within the waiting area of the Hospital's Hematology/Oncology Department.

### Community Events: Dedications, Receptions and Open Houses

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) welcomes and encourages input to ensure our technology and services anticipate patients' constantly changing needs. Residents and employees were invited to many events during 2011 to celebrate areas of growth and to become familiar with the healthcare environment. Dedications, receptions and open houses in 2011 included:

Corporate Breakfasts - The Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Council hosted four Corporate Breakfasts in 2011. The events serve to acquaint local business and community leaders with new services, technology and health trends in the Hospital, as well as the healthcare industry. This year's topics included a summary of the Health Systems' accomplishments and activities in 2010, a spotlight on the new LMHS Endocrinology Practice and the importance of care for endocrine system disorders, a discussion of current trends and advances in the LMH Cardiology program, and an outline of the quality maternal child services and amenities that are offered at the Hospital.

**Pastoral Care Events -** During 2011, LMH hosted various events for members of Licking County's clergy, including an annual dinner and educational event. This year's event, which was held in March, featured a presentation on cancer care. The Hospital's Pastoral Care Department facilitates religious and spiritual services for patients and extended family members.

Dawes Arboretum Planting Ceremony - Executive Director of The Dawes Arboretum Luke Messinger presented a Limelight™ Panicle hydrangea shrub to Licking Memorial Health Systems at a planting ceremony in April. The donation served to recognize the long-standing collaboration of the two organizations and their commitment to the growth and well-being of the Licking County community. The hydrangea was planted outside the walkway in front of Licking Memorial Hospital's Cardiology entrance.

**Cancer Survivor Celebrations -** In recognition of National Cancer Survivors' Day, LMH hosted a series of Cancer Survivor Celebrations throughout the month of June. Refreshments and entertainment were offered in the Jane Cook McConnell Courtyard, and the Courtyard's serene environment provided a place for LMH patients, guests and employees to celebrate and support cancer survivors.

**Art from the Heart Reception -** Families who participated in the Art from the Heart event at The Works museum in February were invited to a reception in the LMH Café in June to view the artwork, which was exhibited as a slideshow presentation.

**LMH Volunteer Garden Dedication -** In June, a new flower garden was dedicated near the LMH Café patio to honor all Hospital volunteers. The LMH Volunteer Garden was donated by the Licking County Foundation's Katharyn Wickham Shannon and Ora C. Shannon Memorial Fund in memory of Katharyn (Katie) Wickham Shannon. Katie was a beloved longtime volunteer at LMH, who served for 34 years, and amassed 16,153 volunteer hours.









Granville Family Practice Open House - A reception was hosted to honor Lawrence A. "Pete" Dils, M.D., who retired from Licking Memorial Family Practice - Granville after 45 years of service to the community. More than 200 individuals attended the event to thank Dr. Dils for his dedicated service. Guests at the reception also welcomed the new Granville Family Practice Physician, Matthew Farrell, M.D., who joined Licking Memorial Health Professionals in June.

**Donor Appreciation Reception -** LMHS thanked contributors during the annual Donor Appreciation Reception in September. The event is an opportunity for donors to be recognized for their generous gifts and receive information on current and future projects at LMHS. At the 2011 reception, the latest piece in the LMHS Main Street Collection, a replica of the Jane Cook McConnell Courtyard, was unveiled for donors who have reached the \$6,500 level of giving. All donations are used to purchase new medical equipment and technology, and enhance the healthcare facilities at LMH.

**LMH TWIGS 6 Granville Thrift Shop Grand Re-Opening -** The LMH TWIGS 6 Granville Thrift Shop officially re-opened to the public with a grand re-opening celebration in October. The Thrift Shop has been in operation for more than 60 years and recently relocated to 1865 Tamarack Road in Newark.

Lifetime Achievement Reception – Each fall, the LMH Development Council hosts the Lifetime Achievement Reception in recognition of individuals who have made an extraordinary difference in the community. The 2011 recipient was John J. O'Neill, who serves as chairman of the Southgate Corporation and executive board member of the Park National Corporation. A special award was presented to posthumously honor Dell "Christine" Warner Powell, who was a

longtime LMHS friend and supporter. The American Red Cross of Licking County, a United Way partner, also was presented with the seventh annual Building a Healthier Community (BAHC) Award to recognize their blood services program volunteers.

**Ultra Sounds Jazz Band CD Release Party -** The Ultra Sounds Jazz Band, a group of musically talented LMHS employees and supporters, celebrated the release of their first album, An Ultra Sonic Christmas, at a CD Release Party at LMH in November. The event launched the sale of the debut album, which was available for purchase through the LMH TWIGS Organization for \$15. The proceeds from the album benefited the Licking Memorial Hematology/ Oncology Department.

Cardiac Rehabilitation Dinner - The LMH Cardiology Department hosted a dinner reception in December to honor patients who have successfully completed the cardiac rehabilitation program. Approximately 40 graduates were in attendance with their friends and family to celebrate their successful completion of the program. More than 2,500 patients have graduated from the program since it began in 1987.

### Community Outreach

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is firmly committed to our mission "To Improve the Health of the Community." The best way to protect community health is to prevent injury and disease; therefore, LMHS devotes many resources to educating the public about healthier lifestyles and proper medical care. ### **Development Council Mission**

To increase charitable giving to the Hospital, and to enhance and promote meaningful community relations resulting in the Hospital's ability to meet community needs and better serve its publics.

### Fundraising

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) relies, in part, on charitable donations to stay in the forefront of technological advances and meet growing community needs. The Development Department at Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) works diligently to ensure that the Hospital has the funds available for continuous improvements and to offset the expense of charity care. Contributions to Licking Memorial Health Foundation (LMHF) are used to purchase equipment and fund programs, capital expenses and facility improvements. In 2011, LMHF received \$15,155.37 in contributions to the general fund in addition to the donations listed below. The contributions are not used for salaries or general operating expenses.

#### **Cornerstone Club**

The Cornerstone Club is comprised of community members who contribute \$100 or more to LMHF. As of 2011, the Cornerstone Club has 140 members who have raised \$22,050 toward the Hematology/Oncology Department Renovations. Donors receive a piece of the Main Street Collection at each \$500 milestone of giving. The 2011 addition to the Main Street Collection recognizes donors who have reached the \$6,500 level of giving. The new piece is a likeness of the Jane Cook McConnell Courtyard, which was made possible by a generous donation from William McConnell and his late wife, Jane.

### The Caduceus Society

Physicians within LMHS have their own opportunities to lend financial support through The Caduceus Society, which is a prestigious giving level for physicians who pledge a gift of \$10,000 or more over a period of 10 years. New members in 2011 included Drs. Thomas and Mary Beth Hall, and Valentine and May Mbah, M.D. The Caduceus Society has a total of 36 members.

### **Founder Level**

In 2011, Jim and Amy Matesich joined the ranks of distinguished Founder Level donors who have made outstanding contributions to LMHF by pledging a gift of \$100,000 or more over 10 years. The Matesich's contribution provided the renovated Hematology/Oncology Department's waiting area with the Rod Callander Memorial Aquarium, a unique, L-shaped, floor-to-ceiling, 450-gallon saltwater tank that was named after Amy's father. A dedication ceremony is planned upon completion of the renovations in the spring of 2012.

### **Benefactor Level**

LMH's Development Council offers a distinctive way to recognize family members, friends or organizations with commemorative bricks. The bricks are available in



two sizes for personalization and placement in one of LMH's exterior walkways. In 2011, 12 commemorative bricks were purchased, totaling \$3,500.

### **Honorary and Memorial Giving Program**

Many community members appreciate the opportunity to pay tribute to a loved one, commemorate a special event or celebrate a recovery through monetary contributions that benefit LMH. In 2011, LMHF received 2 honorary and 44 memorial donations, totaling \$3,710. In addition, 41 contributors made Doctors Day donations to honor their physicians, for a total of \$2,260.

### **Employment**

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) has provided employment opportunities for Licking County residents for more than 100 years. LMHS is not only the largest employer in Licking County, but also has established a reputation as the leading healthcare provider in the community. This distinction is largely due to the dedication of the Health Systems' 1,600 employees who serve diligently to provide quality care for patients and visitors.

Because of that commitment, Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) was named to the U.S. News & World Report's Top 5 list of "Best Regional Hospitals" for 2010-2011. The ranking was based on a careful evaluation of the Hospital's care in 16 key areas of specialty, and a survey of area physicians. LMH's performance in the area of ear, nose and throat procedures, as well as overall medical care, propelled the Hospital onto the Top 5 list.

In 2011, LMHS was named to the Columbus Business First's "Best Places to Work" list for the third consecutive year. More than 90 companies in Central Ohio were nominated for the award, and LMHS was chosen as one of 35 honorees. LMHS also was selected as one of the top five in the large business

category and was the sole Licking County organization to be named to the list. Each company was scored by an independent market research firm through employee surveys. The award was a tribute to the LMHS focus on employee satisfaction, engagement and a culture based on principles of devotion to the community, service excellence, teamwork and recognition.

LMHS is very proud of its highly trained and friendly staff and is honored to celebrate their achievements and special events. In January 2011, employees celebrated 113 years of providing quality health care to the community with an annual interdepartmental competition to collect new blankets and outerwear. The gifts were donated to The Center for New Beginnings and the Salvation Army of Licking County to help individuals and families in need. LMHS also sponsored its fourth annual evening with the Licking County Settlers at Don Edwards Park in June. "LMHS Night" featured a cookout with door prizes and free admission to the Settlers vs. the Lake Erie Monarchs baseball game for all Health Systems' employees and their families. Additionally, LMHS employees participated in several charitable campaigns including the Licking County United Way Campaign, as well as the Food Pantry Network of Licking County's Operation Feed Campaign.





During the annual Hospital & Healthcare Week, LMHS honored the efforts of the Health Systems' employees. The annual celebration featured a health fair to provide employees with information to enhance their own health. LMHS also hosted an outdoor employee cookout and announced special employee recognition awards throughout the week, including the Clarissa Ann Howard Award for Clinical Excellence, MVP Awards and the Manager of the Year Award. During the celebrations, 268 LMHS employees were recognized for their dedication and 5-year-incremental years of service during the Employee Recognition Dinner at the Longaberger Golf Club in May. Wanda Grover, R.N., of Licking Memorial Women's Health received special recognition for providing 45 years of service to the Health Systems.
