Cancer Program Approved by Commission

The Commission on Cancer of the American College of Surgeons has granted Approval to the cancer program at Licking Memorial Hospital.

The Approval recognizes that LMH's cancer program conforms to standards set forth by the American College of Surgeons, which established the Approvals Program in 1932. Recognizing that cancer is a complex group of diseases, the Program promotes consultation among surgeons, medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, diagnostic radiologists, pathologists, and other cancer specialists. This multidisciplinary cooperation results in improved patient care, said Dr. Jacqueline Jones, a medical oncologist with Licking Memorial Health Professionals.

"This Approval further demonstrates LMH's commitment to providing quality services to our patients," said Dr. Jones, who also chairs the hospital's Comprehensive Cancer Care Committee.

The Commission on Cancer designates Approval to facilities that voluntarily commit to undergo a rigorous evaluation process and a performance review. In order to maintain Approval, facilities with approved cancer programs must undergo an on-site review every three years. This is the second on-site survey in which the Commission has granted Approval to LMH, Dr. Jones said.

The American Cancer Society estimated that physicians would diagnose approximately 1,334,100 cases of cancer in 2003. Slightly more than 25 percent of the country's hospitals have approved cancer programs, and those facilities will treat more than 80 percent of newly diagnosed patients.

Maternity Services Receives Level II Licensure

Licking Memorial Hospital Maternity Services has received a Level II Obstetrics and Newborn licensure from the Ohio Department of Health (ODH).

Level II OB services make it possible for expectant mothers with select high-risk conditions to remain in Newark for delivery at Licking Memorial rather than be transferred to Columbus. Level II newborn services provide care to moderately ill pre-term and full-term newborns in addition to stabilization of severely ill newborns for transfer to Columbus.

"This increase in level of services provides us with the opportunity to keep mothers and babies who require a higher level of care together at LMH," said LMH Director of Maternity Services Marcia Fisher, RNC.

A newly renovated nursery offers state-of-the-art equipment and a large, handicap-accessible family transition room where parents can stay close by and learn to care for their newborns with special health care needs.

The LMH Nursery staff has received specialized training in caring for high-risk newborns. The services of a consultant neonatologist from Children's Hospital in Columbus have been arranged to help assure the quality of services provided to these newborns.

LMH is hosting a reception to celebrate its Level II Licensure on Wednesday, May 19, in the Maternity Services area (3rd Floor) of the Hospital from 1-3 p.m. The event is open to the public. For more information, call 348-4300.

LMH's Open Visitation Policy

Licking Memorial Health Systems recognizes the important supportive role that friends and family play in patient care. To accommodate the needs of our patients, the Hospital offers open visitation. Some general guidelines are as follows:

- A visitor may stay with a patient and may visit the patient at any time. A visitor is welcome to spend the night with the patient.

- Between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., visitors should enter through the Hospital's main entrance.

- After hours, visitors should enter through the Emergency Department entrance.

- Healthcare providers may temporarily limit visitation if it is deemed in the patient's best interest. Open visitation will be resumed as soon as the

patient's situation permits.

- Visitation also may be restricted at the request of the patient or the patient's family.

- If a patient is in isolation, we ask that visitation be kept to two visitors at a time and that visitors follow isolation guidelines.

- Requests for support persons during surgical procedures will be handled on an individual basis.

- An adult should accompany children under the age of 12 who visit the Hospital.

LMHS established its visitation policy with the well-being of our patients and the visiting public in mind. If you have any questions, please call the Hospital at 348-4000.

Welcome Wagon Donates Funds to Kids' Place

The Welcome Wagon Club of Licking County has donated \$1,000 to Kids' Place of Licking County. Welcome Wagon Club Vice President Samantha Smith said her organization has donated money to Kids' Place for the past several years. Club members held a garage sale this year to generate the donated funds.

Kids' Place is a facility that provides comprehensive, multi-disciplinary evaluation of children who are suspected victims of abuse and/or neglect. It is a cooperative effort of Licking Memorial Health Systems, Licking County Children's Services, the Licking County Prosecutor's Office, and county law enforcement agencies.

Kids' Place provides a serene, quiet setting comprised of a child interview room, an adult interview room, a conference room, a waiting room, and a fully equipped medical examination room appropriate for abuse evaluations. Services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and are provided in a comfortable and confidential environment. It is located in an off-campus facility donated by LMHS.

No Weapons Allowed

Licking Memorial Health Systems has implemented a policy banning concealed weapons from all of its premises. The policy became effective April 5.

The LMHS policy specifically "prohibits any person from carrying any firearm (to include a concealed or displayed handgun), deadly weapon, or dangerous ordnance onto property," which includes all owned, rented, and leased buildings, and surrounding grounds to include parking areas.

The LMHS policy is in response to Ohio H.B. 12, which became effective April 8. The Bill enables those who submit to a criminal background check and complete training to receive a license to carry a concealed weapon.

"We're taking this issue seriously because we firmly believe that hospital facilities are no place in which people—other than police officers—should be carrying weapons," LMHS Safety Director Joe Tulga explained. "We want to maintain a weapon-free environment to promote safety and security for patients, visitors, and employees."

Cell Phones Now Permitted

Licking Memorial Hospital has changed a longstanding internal policy and now permits cellular phones inside the Hospital.

LMH Public Relations Director Carol Hutchison explained that the Hospital previously did not permit cell phones in its facilities because the transmissions and signals had a high probability of interfering with the operation of certain hospital electronic equipment. However, cell phone standardization, frequency changes, and technology advances now enable the phones to operate without interfering with that equipment.

"The use of cell phones inside our facilities no longer presents issues with patient safety and treatment," commented Hutchison. "The new policy will provide added convenience for our patients, visitors, and staff."
