

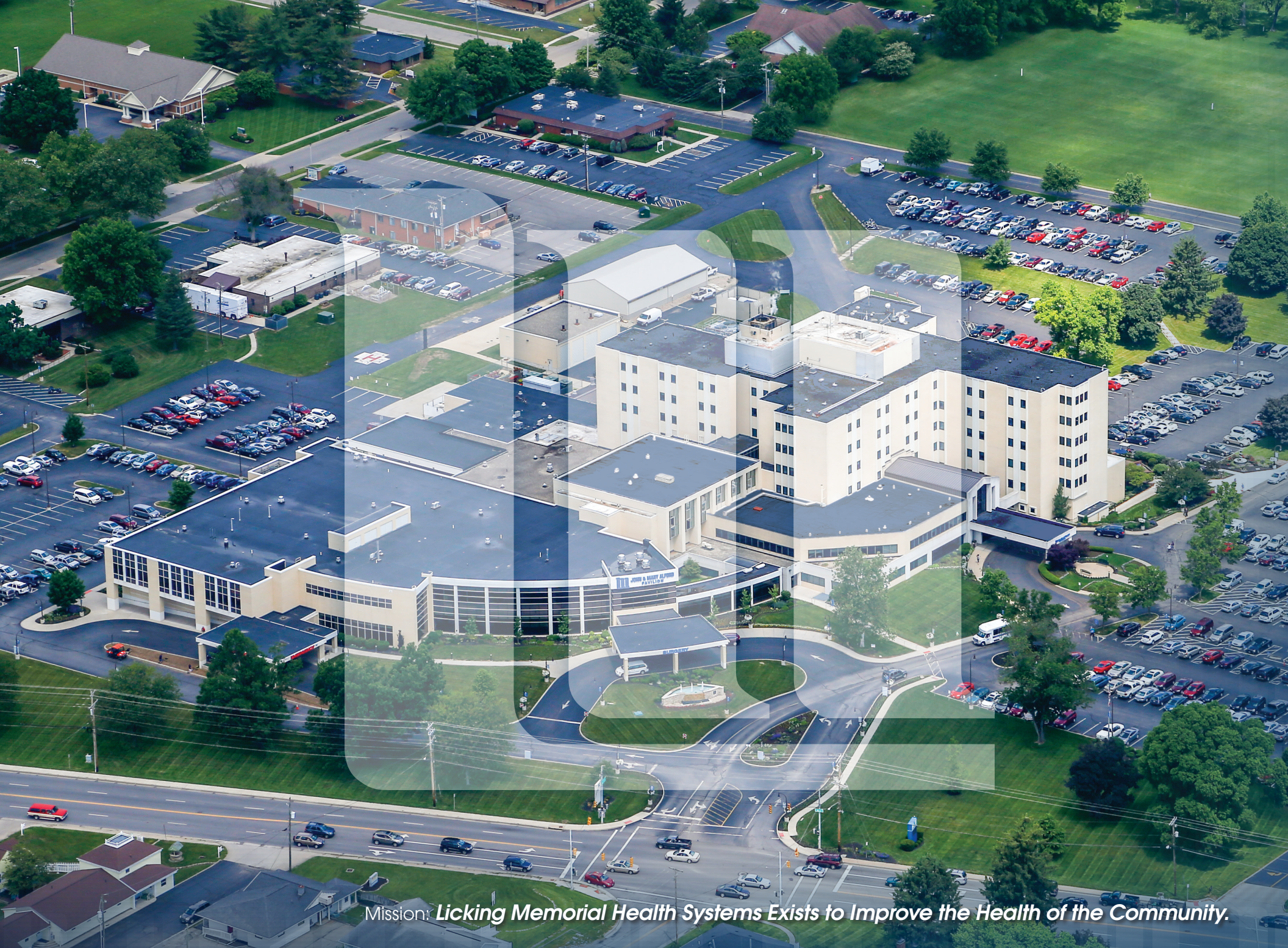

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) continues to be an integral part of the community. I am proud that LMHS is able to respond quickly and directly to our community's needs. Our donors' contributions allow us to improve our facilities with numerous amenities to create a comforting, healing Hospital environment. 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Focusing on the Patient Experience

The approach to health care has changed dramatically since Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) moved to its current location in 1966. Five decades ago, most hospitals featured a sterile, no-frills environment designed to promote physical healing without much emphasis on the patient's emotional comfort. It was common for patients to share a hospital room, family and friends were required to observe specific visiting hours, and patients typically left most major medical decisions up to their physicians' discretion.

Today, as LMH prepares to celebrate its 50th anniversary at 1320 West Main Street in Newark, health care has evolved to include the entire patient experience. Now, in addition to medical testing, diagnosis and treatment, Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) devotes a great deal of planning toward benefitting patients' overall well-being and providing experiences that help the community achieve better health. The patient experience at LMHS has improved recently by adding many new programs and services, including:

- **Maternity Home Visits** – The first few days at home with a newborn baby can be intimidating for first-time parents. LMH now offers free home wellness checks to new mothers a few days following their Hospital dismissal. The nurse checks the baby's overall health indicators and answers any questions about infant care.
- **Patient Experience Managers** – LMH employs two Patient Experience Managers to ensure that the Hospital is providing an excellent experience for all inpatients. Throughout the week, inpatients at LMH receive a visit to discuss the quality of their care and personal comfort. The Patient Experience Managers assist with questions, concerns or special requests, and are available as a contact person for patients should any needs arise while they are in the Hospital or following discharge.
- **Summer Day Camps** – LMHS offers free day camps for youth, ages 7 to 13, with shared challenges. The annual Camp Feelin' Fine takes place in June to provide education, activities and camaraderie to youth who have asthma. In 2015, the Health Systems introduced two new day camps in July. Camp Courageous, which used a superheroes theme in 2015, is designed to help relieve anxiety and stress among youth who have encountered cancer through family or friends. Camp A1c featured a dinosaur theme for youth in establishing friendships and learning more about their diabetes diagnosis.
- **COPD Home Visits** – Patients who are diagnosed with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) at times are overwhelmed about medications, activities and other required changes in their lives. Under a new free program at LMH, a nurse visits select COPD patients who have been dismissed from the Hospital to assist them through the transition. The patients also may consult by phone with the nurse regarding their COPD concerns.
- **Walk with a Doc** – LMHS hosts free monthly Walk with a Doc events to encourage participants to engage in healthful activity and provide them an opportunity to chat with a physician in an informal setting. In 2015, topics included: seasonal affective disorder, menopause and anti-aging strategies, and healthy lifestyle changes.
- **Annual Reunion Events** – In 2011, LMH introduced the annual Cancer Survivors' Picnic event, to celebrate and acknowledge all survivors and their families. In 2015, the Hospital began hosting annual reunions to celebrate patients who received care in the Hospital's Interventional Cardiology or Acute Inpatient Rehabilitation units. Twenty-one patients and guests attended the first Acute Inpatient Rehabilitation Reunion in August. They were treated to free massages, exercise demonstrations, blood pressure screenings, information about life after rehabilitation, speakers and a cookout.

The first annual LMH Interventional Cardiology Reunion took place in October with free massages, exercise demonstrations, blood pressure screenings, a cooking demonstration and speakers. Twenty-two patients and their guests also enjoyed a complimentary heart-healthy dinner.

- **CBORD & Room Service Revitalize Hospital Food Service at LMH** – In order to improve patients' experience and satisfaction with their meals, LMH introduced CBORD and Room Service Choice in August. CBORD interfaces with MEDITECH, the Hospital's electronic health record, to serve patients according to their dietary needs and restrictions. Room Service Choice allows for a variety of foods to be made to order and customized to diet and taste preferences.

"When Baby Graham was born a little less than six weeks ahead of his due date, he was taken to LMH's Special Care Nursery for close observation and heightened care. It was difficult to be separated from Graham, but I understood that he needed to be monitored. We were welcome to be with Graham 24/7. We were even able to stay in the mother-baby suite as overnight guests for as long as Graham was still in the Hospital. That was a real blessing for us because my days were a blur. Eric works at LMH, and staying at the Hospital made it possible for him to be with Graham and me any time that he was not working."

"I smoked my first cigarette at age 11. But when I was expecting my first child, I became increasingly aware of the dangers that smoking presented to my developing baby. I was really afraid that my baby could be born with breathing issues. I also noticed that it was becoming difficult for me to breathe. Being on a tight budget and expecting a baby, there was no way that I could afford to purchase nicotine replacement products. When I learned that I could receive the products for free, and LMHS would even provide incentives for participating in the program, it took a big weight off my shoulders. Besides, I could make my tobacco cessation appointments immediately following my regular obstetric appointments since their offices are in the same building. They made it so easy – there were no more excuses not to quit! One month after I quit smoking, I realized I was breathing more easily. Carter was born at full term and has not been sick one day. I am so proud that I was able to give him an excellent start in life by breastfeeding and quitting smoking."



Nancy Mitchell, Emergency Care Patient

"My sandal caught on a ridge in the garage floor, and I fell forward very quickly – I did not even drop the small juice glass I was carrying. When I landed, the glass broke and deeply cut the ring finger on my left hand. My husband, Jim, is the type who usually wants to wait until the next day to see a doctor, but this



time he said that we needed to go to the emergency room right away. My finger was bleeding pretty badly. We went to the LMH Emergency Department and were seen and cared for quickly. Dr. Randy Jones advised me to make an appointment for further evaluation. The next morning I received a call from Orthopedic Specialists and Sports Medicine, Inc. The Emergency Department had already referred me and the staff was calling to let me know I could be seen later that morning. My exam confirmed that I had tendon and nerve damage and that I would need surgery to repair the injury. While I wanted to wait until after my daughter's graduation party, the surgeon was adamant that the surgery take place sooner. I still cannot bend my finger completely and have some nerve damage, but these effects could have been much worse had it not been for the quick, professional treatment I received. The nurses in the Emergency Department were wonderful. They kept checking on me and telling me to hang in there."

"I had been deadlifting up to 265 pounds earlier this summer, and one day, I noticed after I got home that I had a bulge on my belly. It started to hurt, so I made an appointment with my family physician. But two days before the appointment, the pain became severe so I went to the Emergency Department at Licking Memorial Hospital. I knew that a hernia can be dangerous if left untreated. I already assumed that I would need surgery to repair the hernia, and it was an easy decision to have it performed

at LMH even though I live just as close to other hospitals in Columbus. I liked the idea that all my patient information is connected within Licking Memorial Health Systems' electronic health records. For me, that was a convenience and an added safety factor. The staff attended to my wife, Kayla, as well as to me. They explained everything well to her and confidently addressed all her questions. Her impression of the experience was very positive. Everybody on staff was excellent, and I was quite impressed. Dr. Brent Savage is a really nice guy – from the outset, he made me feel confident about his skills as a surgeon. I'd recommend him to anyone. It's not good that I had to have the surgery, but it's good that I had it at Licking Memorial Hospital."

Sharon Carpenter, Stroke Patient

"I woke up in the hospital in Zanesville and couldn't talk or move my legs. I had suffered a stroke. My doctor told me that I would probably benefit from intensive therapy in an acute inpatient rehabilitation program, and the best place to get that would be at Licking Memorial Hospital where I would receive personalized attention. I came to LMH in a wheelchair and thought 'What can they do in two weeks?' Dr. David Koontz came in to see me nearly every day. The nurses, therapists and aides were all so friendly and encouraging. They explained that their goal was to prepare me to be able to function again in my own home environment. The Unit is set up to feel like a home. There was even a computer that I could use to update my family and friends on my progress. I also liked how the Unit was very quiet, which was relaxing and made it easy to sleep. Just 17 days after I suffered my stroke, I returned home. I didn't think it would be possible to make so much progress in such a short time. When I left LMH, I was able to walk with a cane. I am sure that all the attention that I received helped me recover much more quickly."

"Cardiac rehab is great, first of all, because of the great staff. They encourage you to work hard, but you don't know you're working hard because they make it fun. I felt more confident about exercising while I was hooked up to the EKG, and the staff was nearby. They would not let something bad happen to me. I felt so much better after going through the program. I have made important lifestyle changes since my cardiac arrest. I watch my diet and walk two miles every other day. I also gave up smoking. They threw away my cigarettes in the Cath Lab, and I haven't had one since. I am so grateful that Dr. Hassan Rajjoub and the Cath Lab team at LMH have such advanced knowledge and skills."

Changes, Enhancements and Technology

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is dedicated to keeping abreast of medical advances and improving the healthcare experience for patients and their families. In many instances, the changes are subtle and take place without public awareness. Changes and improvements at LMHS over the past year include:

New e-Registration System, SafeChx for LMH

Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) now offers patients advanced protection against medical identity theft with SafeChx, a secure patient identification technology system. The new system helps prevent medical identity fraud, eliminate duplicate records and improve patient outcomes. SafeChx verifies a patient's medical identity and links patients to their LMH medical information simply by scanning the patient's finger.



Breast Density Awareness Program Launched

LMHS launched a breast density awareness program to inform screening mammography patients of their breast density, promote a patient-centric approach to breast cancer screening and

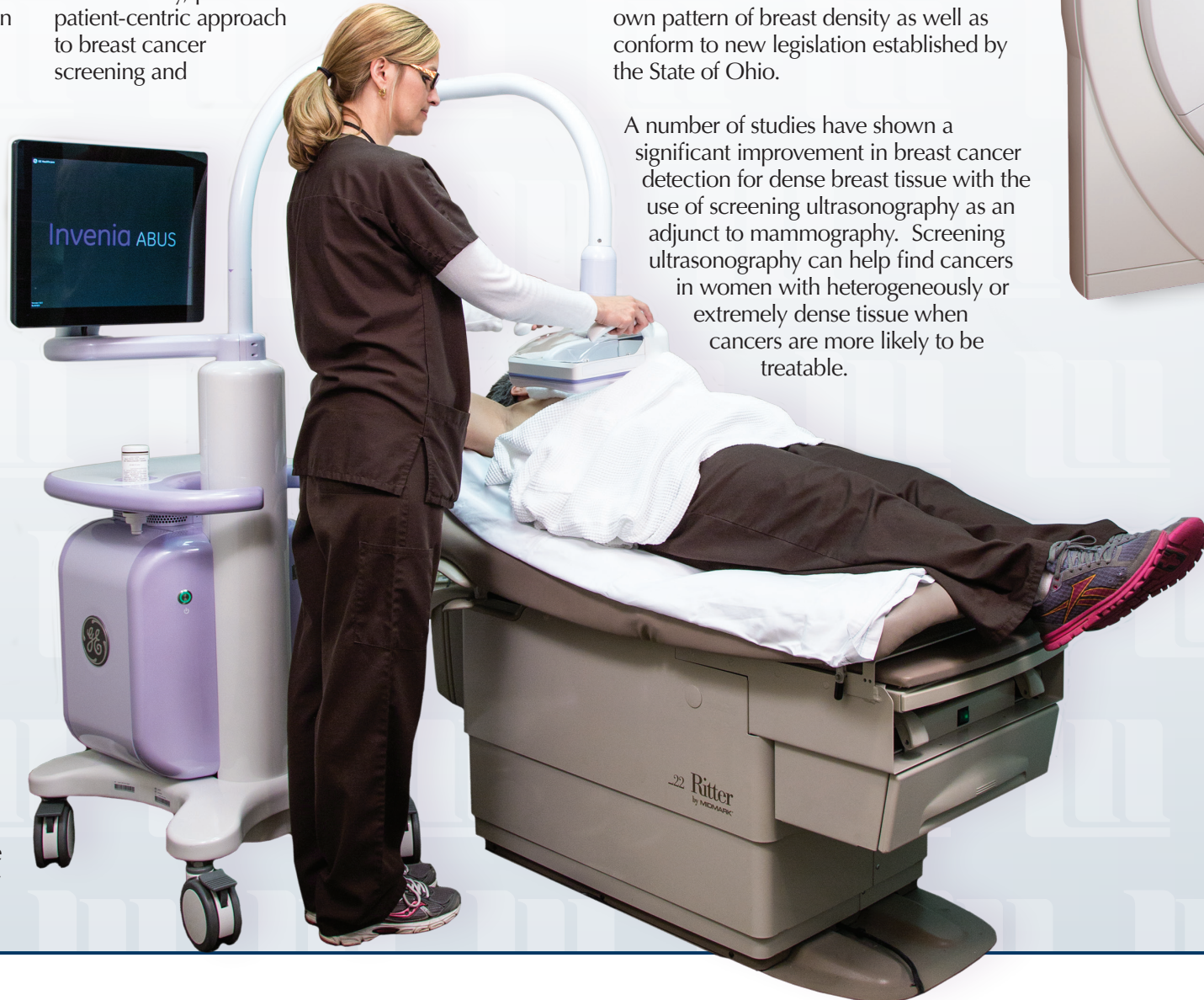
offer supplemental 3D screening Automated Breast Ultrasound (ABUS). The program will help inform women about the cancer risks associated with their own pattern of breast density as well as conform to new legislation established by the State of Ohio.

A number of studies have shown a significant improvement in breast cancer detection for dense breast tissue with the use of screening ultrasonography as an adjunct to mammography. Screening ultrasonography can help find cancers in women with heterogeneously or extremely dense tissue when cancers are more likely to be treatable.

LMH Physical Therapy Offers Top Recovery Treatment Method

The LMH Physical Therapy Department is equipped with new devices designed to enhance recovery while minimizing pain for physical therapy patients. Providing active compression and cold therapy simultaneously, The Game Ready® Active Compression and Cold Exchange Loop (ACCEL™) systems are used in the treatment of post-surgical and acute soft tissue injuries, such as joint replacements or sprains.

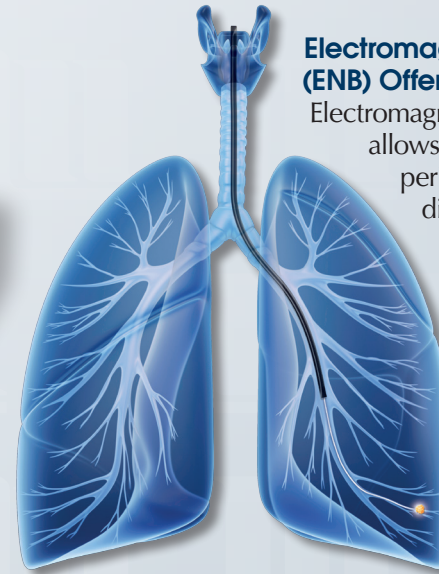
Game Ready's ACCEL technology increases the speed and effectiveness of recovery treatment while decreasing pain. Attachable sleeves for different joints and muscles allow the temperature of the entire injury site to be controlled, and the air pressure creates a better surface contact, enhancing the ability to deliver the cold treatment.





Upgraded CT Scanners Provide High Image Quality and Increased Speed

In early 2015, LMH upgraded the computed tomography (CT) scanners in the Emergency and Radiology Departments, representing the latest in imaging technology. These scanners are able to obtain higher resolution images in just a fraction of the time, allowing for a quicker, more comfortable patient experience. The increased image quality and speed offered by the new machines contribute to the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of a variety of illnesses with greater efficiency and accuracy.



Electromagnetic Navigational Bronchoscopy® (ENB) Offers Safer Option for Lung Biopsy

Electromagnetic Navigational Bronchoscopy® (ENB) allows access to the small airway passages in the periphery of the lungs that previously were difficult to reach. Basically a road map of the patient's lungs, ENB identifies the exact spot where the lesion is located in order to collect a biopsy.

ENB provides a less invasive pathway to peripheral lung nodules, even for patients with procedure-restricting conditions. The benefit of ENB is potentially detecting lung cancer earlier and enhancing treatment options for patients.



Reveal LINQ™ Improves Heart Monitoring

A new method of recording the heart's activity now is available at LMH for patients with a difficult-to-diagnose heart rhythm. Medtronic's Reveal LINQ™ Insertable Cardiac Monitor is capable of recording abnormal heart rhythms that other monitoring devices may not detect.

The implanted Reveal LINQ device wirelessly transmits any abnormal activity it records to a monitor that is kept nearby and uploads a daily report to Licking Memorial Cardiology through global cellular phone signals. Early detection of these conditions saves lives and allows for better treatment options to protect the patient's heart muscle from damage.

Medical Office Facility Groundbreaking

In Fall 2015, the Health Systems broke ground on a new 33,260-square-foot medical office building on West Main Street. The first floor will be occupied by the Center for Sight, and the Licking Memorial Orthopedic Surgery practice will be located on the second floor. The facility is slated for completion in August 2016.



Community Events

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) encourages community input to ensure that our technology and services anticipate the constantly changing needs of our patients. Throughout 2015, residents and employees were invited to numerous events celebrating achievement and areas of growth. Cancer Survivors' Picnic

LMH hosted the fifth annual Cancer Survivors' Picnic on June 7 in recognition of National Cancer Survivors' Day. Three hundred LMH patients, guests and employees gathered on the Hospital lawn to celebrate and support cancer survivors as well as to honor loved ones who lost their battle with cancer.

Donor Appreciation Reception

During the Donor Appreciation Reception, hosted by the LMH Development Council in September, LMHS thanked contributors for their generous gifts and provided information about current and future LMHS initiatives. All donations to Licking Memorial Health Foundation are used to purchase new medical equipment and technology and enhance LMH healthcare facilities.

LMHS staff devoted their time in Summer 2015 to educate local youth, ages 7 to 13, about various health topics during three fun, outdoor day camps at Infirmary Mound Park in Granville. In June, Camp Feelin' Fine allowed kids to spend a day learning the best way to care for their asthma and interact with others who have the same condition. Camp Courageous, held in July, aimed to help youth who have encountered

cancer through family and friends to reduce stress and anxiety. In August, LMHS hosted Camp A1c – a day camp for youth with diabetes to learn about the health condition and how to manage it, and to provide an opportunity to interact with other youth with diabetes.

Corporate Breakfasts

To introduce local business and community leaders to new services, technology and healthcare trends of the Hospital – as well as the entire healthcare industry – four Corporate Breakfasts were hosted by the Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Council in 2015. The breakfast discussions included the growth of LMHS in 2014, winter safety tips, demystifying depression and a presentation from cancer survivor Sean Swarner.

Pastoral Care Event

In April, LMH hosted the annual appreciation event for the clergy of Licking County. The dinner presentation discussed ministering to patients with Alzheimer's disease and dementia. The LMH Pastoral Care Department serves the spiritual needs of patients and their families, visitors and staff members while also acting as an intermediary between the Hospital and the local clergy.

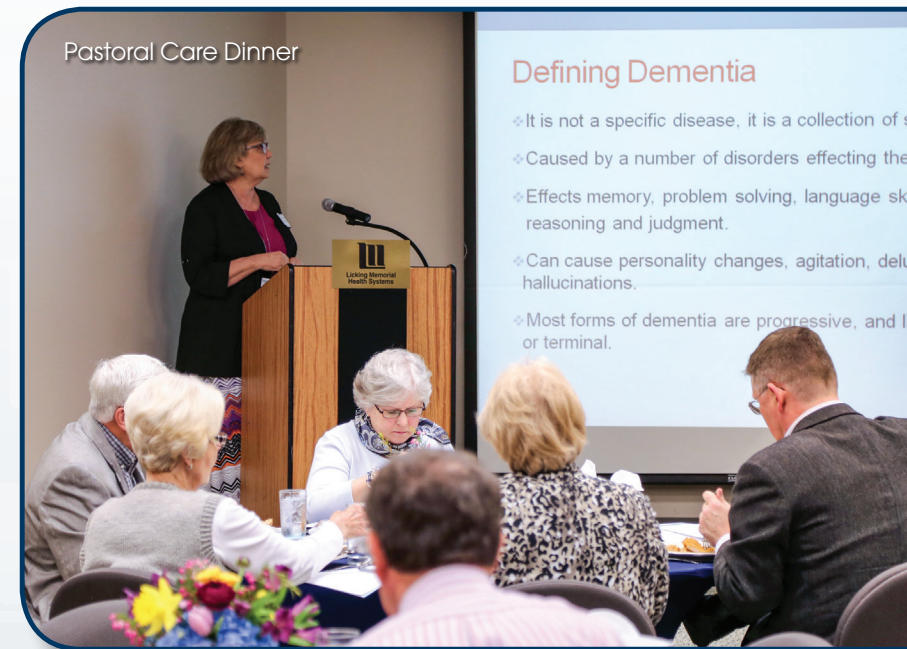

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Fundraising

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) relies, in part, on charitable donations to proactively incorporate technological advances and meet growing community needs. The Development Department at Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) works diligently to ensure that the Hospital has the funds available for continuous improvements. Contributions to Licking Memorial Health Foundation (LMHF) are used to purchase equipment and to fund programs, capital expenses, and facility improvements. The contributions are not used for salaries or general operating expenses.

Community Cornerstone Club – The Community Cornerstone Club is comprised of individuals, couples and businesses who contribute \$100 or more to LMHF. As of 2015, the Cornerstone Club has 199 members who raised \$30,650 toward the Women’s Health and Maternal Child portion of the 2015 Radiology Initiative. Donors receive a Main Street Collection recognition piece at each \$500 milestone of giving. The 2015 addition to the Main Street Collection recognizes donors who have reached the \$8,500 level of giving. The new piece is a replica of the Café Area with Fireplace, located in The John & Mary Alford Pavilion.

The Caduceus Society – Physicians have a special opportunity to lend financial support through The Caduceus Society, which is a prestigious giving level for physicians who pledge a gift of \$10,000 or more over a period of 10 years. 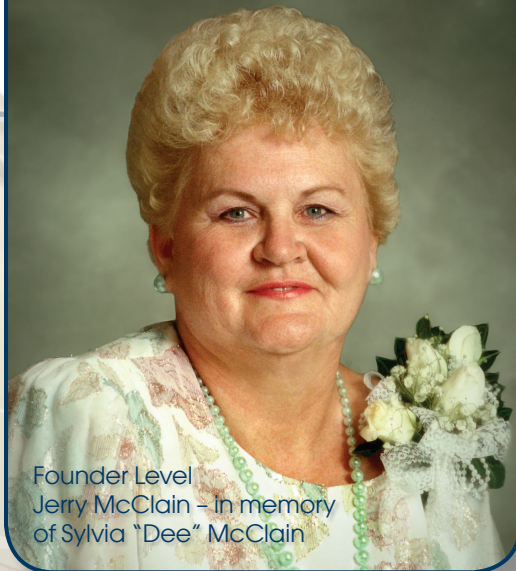

Personalized bricks are available in two sizes and are placed in one of LMH's exterior walkways. A total of 17 commemorative bricks were purchased and placed on the grounds in 2015.

Honorary and Memorial Giving Program – Many community members appreciate the opportunity to pay tribute to a loved one, commemorate a special event or celebrate a recovery through monetary contributions that benefit LMH. In 2015, LMHF received six honorary and 45 memorial donations. In addition, 40 contributors made Doctors' Day donations to honor their physicians.

Cradle Roll – In 2015, the births of 21 new babies were commemorated through gifts to the Cradle Roll program at LMH. Gifts of \$150 to \$249 receive a hand-crafted step up stool, while gifts of \$250 or more receive a hand-crafted child-size rocker. Employment

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) has provided employment opportunities for Licking County residents for more than 117 years. This distinction is largely due to the dedication of the Health Systems' 1,900-plus employees who serve diligently to provide quality care for patients and visitors.

LMHS has high standards for its employees and believes in recognizing and rewarding their accomplishments through various celebrations, including monthly Dining with the Stars recognition breakfasts and luncheons, bimonthly employee birthday events, and annual recognition dinners. LMHS also offers a comprehensive benefits package that includes a generous paid time off plan, a robust wellness program, a pension plan, tuition assistance, free uniforms, and free access to various wellness center sites, as well as excellent health, dental and vision insurance.

LMHS Ranked Among the Nation's Top 20 Best Workplaces in Health Care – Fortune and Great Place to Work® released their evaluations after nearly 30,000 healthcare employees in the United States responded anonymously to surveys about their workplace environment. LMHS was ranked ninth among the nation's thousands of healthcare organizations as a best place to work.
