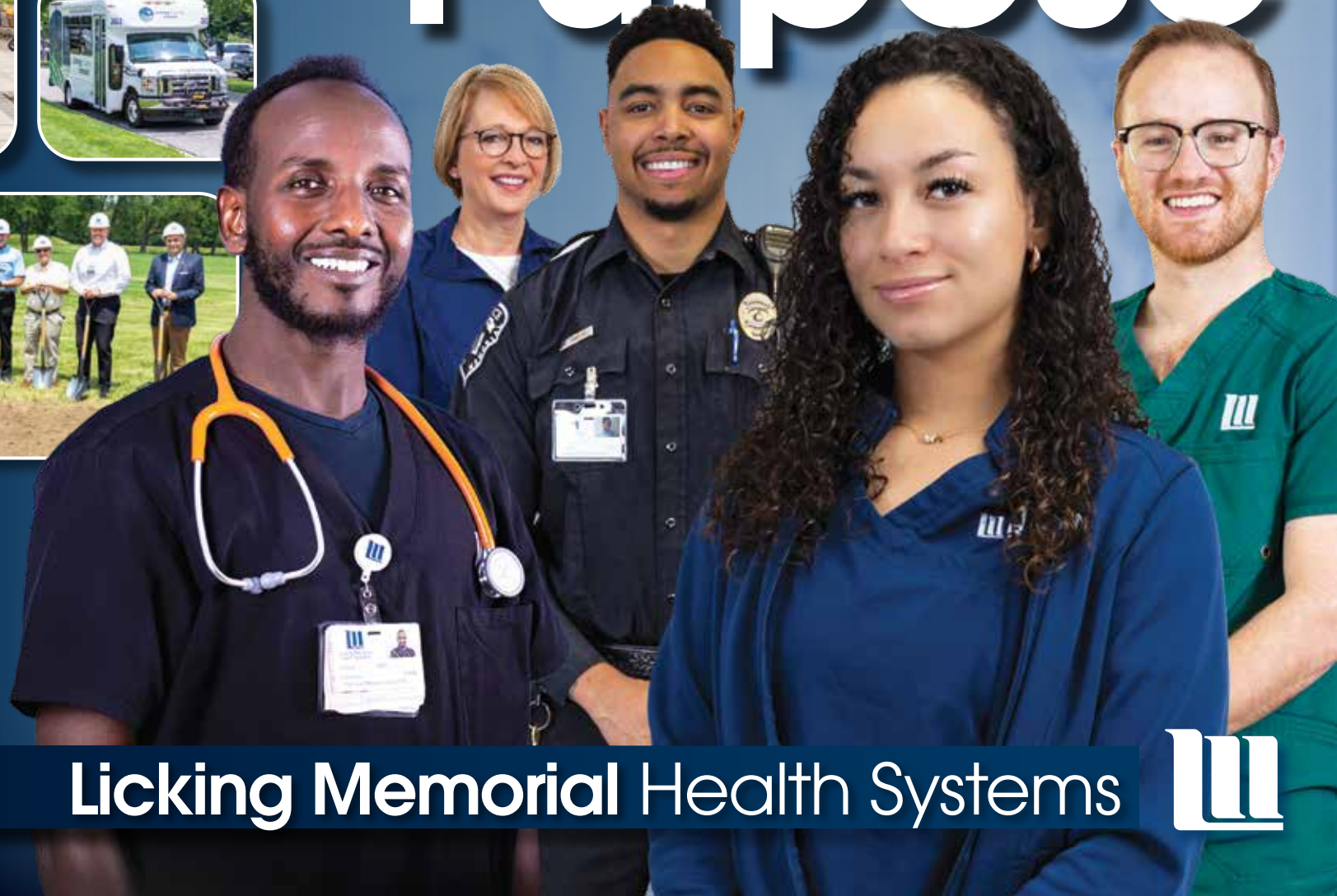

# A Message from the President

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) serves as more than a healthcare organization. Our mission to improve the health of the community inspires our leaders and employees to assist other organizations in increasing the quality of life for Licking County residents. Throughout 2025, LMHS has continued to lead with a purpose throughout the community which consists of our family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers.

Over the past few years, LMHS has become more focused on the impact of the social drivers of health, such as transportation, food insecurity, and housing. Health disparities arise when community members struggle to find transportation in order to receive medical care, acquire groceries, and find affordable housing. We have learned that removing obstacles to obtaining fresh produce and transportation services is vital to creating a healthy, thriving community, and improves health as well as quality of life.

As an independent, community health system, LMHS is better able to connect with other non-profit organizations and form partnerships that benefit Licking County. In 2025, LMHS continued to support Licking County Transit which now has five bus routes that offer residents the needed transportation to visit with physicians to receive care and access to stores that offer fresh produce and healthy food choices. The bus routes have become so popular that a mid-day service was added on the Main Street route that travels to each stop

every 30 minutes, and ridership continues to increase as more people take advantage of the service.

Increasing availability of healthy fruits and vegetables remains a top priority as well. In partnership with the Food Pantry Network (FPN) of Licking County, LMHS assists in operating a food pantry on the west side of Newark that offers multiple fresh produce options. Working with FPN also ensures that residents have better access to the groceries they need. The number of families visiting the pantry has doubled from 2024. While families have been encouraged to use the food pantry, LMHS has been providing free fruits and vegetables to residents with specific diseases, such as cancer, through the Fruit and Vegetable Rx Program. Dozens of patients are given a prescription to receive the nutritious foods needed for recovery.

In addition to assisting with food and transportation, our employees volunteer their time on Habitat for Humanity build projects. Each year, dozens of staff members offer their skills to build a home for a family in need of better housing. To date, LMHS has participated in the building of 12 houses in Newark.

While our staff and leadership support other area organizations, we also work hard to continue providing top quality care for the community. Upgrading equipment and technology, hiring highly qualified staff, purchasing quality supplies, expanding services, and maintaining our facilities remain the highest priorities for our organization.

Such commitment to care overcomes the misconception that patients need to travel to a large, multi-hospital group to receive top quality healthcare. In 2025, we increased safety measures by purchasing new technologies to clean and disinfect surfaces, track surgical equipment, and monitor the facilities for threats. We have also expanded the use of our electronic health record, MyChart, to offer patients more access to their information and allow more participation in their healthcare. In addition, we continue to advance our services including new procedures in cardiology.

As LMHS continues to lead with a purpose, we are looking forward to the future. Construction began in 2025 on The Center at LMHS. The facility will serve as a place to meet, learn, and share in activities that promote healthy lifestyles and offer valuable resources. As Licking County continues to grow and thrive, the Center will enhance the opportunity for education, connectivity, and relationships within our community. The new facility will be a resource that LMHS is willing to share with other nonprofit organizations for their events. More importantly, LMHS will be able to host events focused

on encouraging prevention and the importance of living a healthy lifestyle. Our staff members will also have a dedicated space to enhance and sharpen their skills.

I am sincerely grateful for our donors' contributions to assist in the building of the new education and event center and the many amenities that create a comforting, healing Hospital environment. These individuals play a role in helping Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) and LMHS remain successfully independent as do our loyal patients who spread the word of the excellent care that they receive. In addition, I am grateful for our employees, medical staff, members of the LMH and LMHS Boards of Directors, Volunteers, TWIGS, and the entire LMHS family, who work diligently to ensure that top quality care and services are provided to meet the community's healthcare needs.

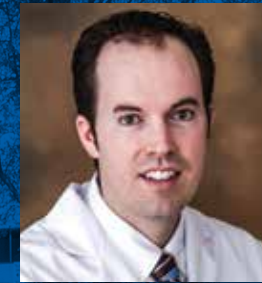

# Changes, Enhancements, and Technology

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) implements the best modern medical advances to improve healthcare experiences and outcomes for patients. Changes may be subtle and take place without public awareness. Enhancements and modifications at LMHS over the past year include:

## New Instrument Tracking Software

Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) implemented the CensiTrac Surgical Instrument Tracking System to help manage the Hospital's vast inventory of surgical instruments and medical devices and provide a state-of-the-art tracking system from sterilization to patient use. CensiTrac automates many aspects of the instrument management system and reduces the time that staff members spend manually tracking instruments and devices while providing transparency to surgical and sterile processing staff on the various stages involved in reprocessing. By using barcode scanning and advanced software analytics, CensiTrac ensures that surgical instruments and medical devices are meticulously tracked through every step of the process, eliminating the potential for lost or misplaced items. With the ability to streamline workflows and simplify the surgical instrument administration process, the system plays a crucial role in improving operations, enhancing patient care, and reducing costs.

## MoonBeam 3 Ultraviolet (UV)-C Disinfection Device

Focusing on patient safety, LMHS invested in technology to disinfect high-touch surfaces. The MoonBeam 3 uses UV-C disinfection, which is considered "germicidal UV." When deployed, the device emits UV-C light that damages nucleic acids, leading to inactivation of pathogens such as bacteria, viruses, and fungi. The MoonBeam 3 is an additive disinfection technology and does not replace LMHS' highly trained cleaning staff. All areas are manually cleaned before UV disinfection occurs. The device is portable and requires less than a minute to set up, fits anywhere, and eliminates the pathogens within three minutes. Three individually adjustable, articulating arms can be positioned at almost any angle to target the UV-C light, enabling improved UV-C dosing with reduced energy. The flexible device is easily positioned throughout a room to enable fast and effective disinfection cycles.

## Medical Image Viewing Available in MyChart

LMHS incorporated patient access to Picture Archiving and Communication System (PACS) images through MyChart. Patients can view a variety of diagnostic images from the patient portal, including Radiology, Cardiology, and operating room imaging. These include, but are not limited to, X-rays, computed tomography (CT) scans, magnetic resonance imaging (MRIs), ultrasounds, mammograms, and nuclear medicine imaging. Allowing patients access to medical images through MyChart provides several benefits, including increased patient understanding of their condition, improved communication with their healthcare provider, enhanced engagement in their treatment plan, and the ability to review images at their convenience, all while promoting a more proactive approach to their health management.

## New Cardiac Intervention Procedure Breaks Up Calcification

Hassan Rajjoub, M.D., of Licking Memorial Cardiology, is using new technology to break up calcification in the arteries before placing a stent for a better outcome for the patient. Shockwave intravascular lithotripsy (IVL) was recently approved for use in the United States. Shockwave disrupts coronary calcium through acoustic shock waves, modifying the calcium in a safe, effective manner to assist in restoring vessel compliance prior to stent deployment. Dr. Rajjoub threads a small wire containing the device that generates the shock wave along with the balloon and guides it to the calcified area. The shock wave fractures the calcium and allows for effective stent deployment. IVL is a breakthrough technology allowing successful, safe treatment of the calcified lesions that were previously untreatable with angioplasty and stenting.



## LMHS Offers Access to High-performance PET/CT Scanner

LMHS added two more service days per month for access to a high performance, energy-efficient positron emission tomography/computed tomography (PET/CT) scanner with a wide range of clinical capabilities. The Trinion PET/CT scanner is all digital and delivers an increase in sensitivity that leads to faster scan times at a lower dose of radiation with high-quality images. The Trinion's state-of-the-art features include motion correction technology and enhanced image reconstruction to provide healthcare professionals with a powerful tool for diagnosing and monitoring a wide range of medical conditions including cancer and neurological disorders. With more accurate results, patients receive a more personalized treatment plan. The advanced software aids in early detection and monitoring of diseases, ultimately leading to better patient outcomes. The faster scan times and reduced radiation exposure creates a safer imaging process and benefits both patients and staff.

## More Convenient Scheduling Options through MyChart

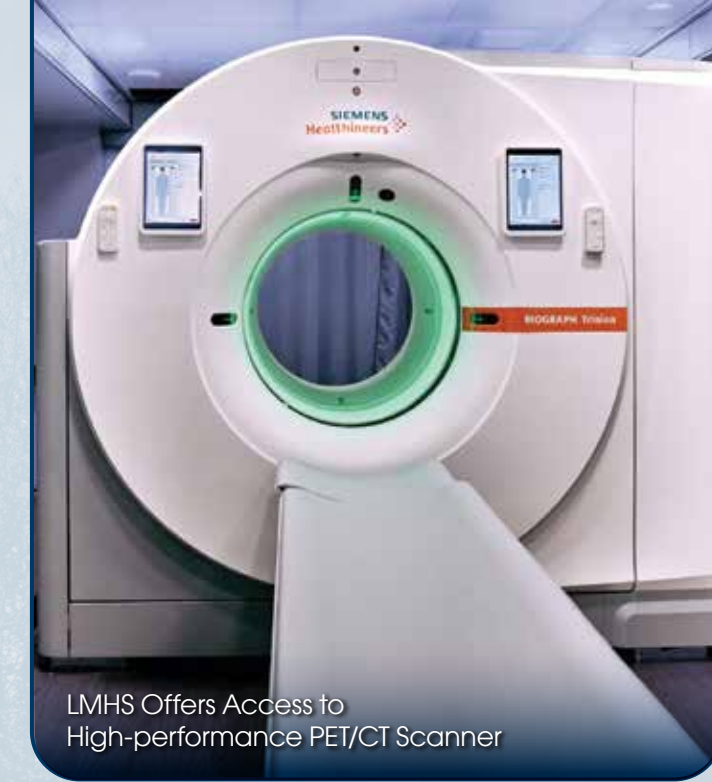
LMHS began offering a quick, convenient method to schedule appointments for imaging examinations with the LMH Radiology Department. Patients can use their electronic health record, MyChart, to make the appointment. Most advanced imaging, including CT scans, MRI, ultrasound, and mammography may be self-scheduled at all available locations.

## Walk-in Wednesdays

LMH Radiology established Walk-in Wednesdays for screening mammograms. Every Wednesday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., women in need of a screening mammogram can receive the service at LMH Women's Imaging Center at the Hospital without a scheduled appointment or provider referral. Eligible women should be 40 years of age or older, have no medical breast concerns, and have not had a screening mammogram in the past year. Patients are seen on a first come, first served basis.

## Main Street Coffee Renovation

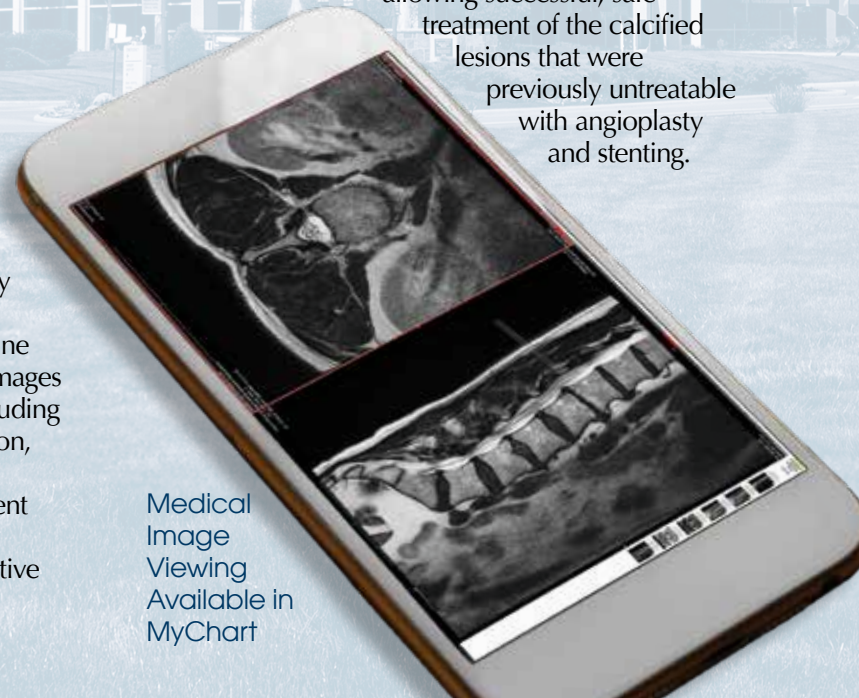
LMH began renovation of Main Street Coffee in July. During the renovation, Main Street Coffee relocated to the MOD station in the Main Street Café on the LMH Ground Floor and offered a variety of breakfast and lunch items inspired by the menu served at any branded Starbucks establishment. Main Street Coffee re-opened in October, and the newly renovated space features all-new Nitro Cold Brew and an expanded food menu based on feedback received during the relocation to the Main Street Café MOD station. Main Street Coffee is open from 6:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Saturday and Sunday.

# Leading with a Purpose

While Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is the primary healthcare provider in Licking County, the mission of improving the health of the community goes far beyond offering the best quality care. Leading with a purpose means embracing new technologies and techniques to remain a top-notch Health System while ensuring residents are able to obtain transportation, fresh foods, and quality housing. To fulfill this vision, LMHS proudly partners with other local nonprofit organizations to boost the quality of life for all residents. In addition to financial support, members of LMHS Leadership volunteer their time and skills as Board members and participants in local nonprofit organizations such as the United Way, Food Pantry Network (FPN), Newark Development Partners, Salvation Army, and the American Red Cross.

In the past few years, the organization has focused on how social drivers, such as housing, food insecurity, and transportation, affect community health and have taken steps to reduce health disparities in Licking County. To assist with housing, LMHS supports the

Licking County Housing Investment Fund, Affordable Housing Trust, and Habitat for Humanity. The availability and affordability of transportation are intertwined with housing location.

Health implications of limited public transportation include missed or delayed healthcare appointments, decreased prescription compliance, and increased health expenditures, leading to poorer health outcomes. To avoid such outcomes, LMHS has been working to assist community members with transportation. LMH Ride was established in 2019, providing free transportation for non-emergent healthcare appointments. In 2025, the program provided 906 rides to patient appointments. In addition, LMHS worked with Licking County Transit to establish bus transportation throughout the county.

The bus service, which includes five separate fixed routes, now runs hourly from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.. The Main Street route offers a mid-day service every 30 minutes, and stops at several LMHS facilities where bus shelters have been erected for riders' use.

The LMHS Medical Campus located at 1717 West Main Street serves as a hub for all the routes. The first established route travels along Main Street in Newark to the Licking County Aging Program/Heritage Hall. The additional routes connect the Licking Memorial Medical Campus hub to Granville, North 21st Street, Heath, and Buckeye Lake, where shopping and other needed services are available.

Over 31,000 passengers took advantage of the Main Street route in 2025, an increase of nearly 30 percent from 2024.

LMHS Supports Licking County Transit's Expanded Routes

In addition to transportation needs, LMHS has been working with the Food Pantry Network (FPN) to address food insecurity in the community. To support FPN, LMHS took the initiative to assist in opening the FPN Market. An LMHS building, which is located in an area not previously served by FPN, was donated for use. The Market offers eligible customers a grocery-style shopping experience with a selection of food items including fresh produce, dry goods, dairy, and meat products. LMHS employees and volunteers assist in the daily operation of the Market. Total customers have more than doubled since last year with 34,369 people visiting the Market. LMHS also provides the Fruit and Vegetable Prescription Program (FVRx) which offers free, fresh produce to patients who have been diagnosed with chronic health conditions such as breast cancer and chronic kidney disease with prediabetes or diabetes and obesity.

Leading in top quality healthcare, LMHS continues to invest in new technologies and methodologies to remain at the forefront of modern care. In 2025, the clinical staff worked to improve the way that patients are treated for sepsis, the body's extreme response to an infection. An estimated 750 lives have been saved due to the new model for treatment, and Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) has been recognized for the dramatic 57 percent decrease in mortality due to the disease and the high rate of compliance with State and National standards. Also in 2025, the Cardiology Department optimized practices to provide high-quality, patient outcomes by increasing use of advanced technologies such as Shockwave therapy for the treatment of calcified coronary artery disease (see page 8). In addition, mobile cardiac telemetry monitoring has been improved by expanding wear options to support monitoring for up to 30 days.

For maternity patients, a new obstetric simulation manikin, known as Lucina, was purchased for comprehensive training of maternal and fetal care. The manikin provides real-time feedback on performance, vital signs, and outcomes. The manikin has just been acquired, and training will begin soon. New infant beds have also been purchased for the Special Care Nursery. The Giraffe OmniBed offers a womb-like, temperature-controlled environment. It reduces stress on the infant by reducing physical movement and repositioning with 360-degree mattress rotation and automated tilting features. Sound-reduction features promote infant rest while the entire design promotes safety, stability, and reduces risk of tube dislodgement.

Other new technologies include advances in respiratory care, point-of-care blood testing, and new identification software for Laboratory Services to reduce wait time for results for serious diseases such as Lyme disease and tuberculosis. In Radiology, women can obtain abbreviated breast screening magnetic resonance imaging (MRI). Some tumors may be undetectable in X-ray images, particularly if a woman has dense breasts, which have much more fibrous and glandular tissue than fatty tissue. For this reason, an MRI is often recommended as a supplemental screening method for women with dense breasts. This screening tool is also recommended for patients who are at a genetically high risk for breast cancer. Mammography Walk-In Wednesdays have also been implemented.

Assisting residents to maintain a healthy lifestyle includes education pertaining to prevention and healthy choices. To better serve the community, LMHS is working to build a designated education and event center. The Center at LMHS will provide a modern, well-equipped facility that will serve as a place to meet, learn, and share in activities that promote healthy lifestyles and offer valuable resources. It is conveniently located adjacent to the main Hospital campus. The facility will feature versatile event spaces to accommodate a variety of program formats and audience sizes. Dedicated learning environments will enable focused instruction and training for professional development. The intimate gathering spaces will promote collaboration and strengthen community partnerships. Construction began in the summer of 2025, and completion is anticipated by fall of 2026.

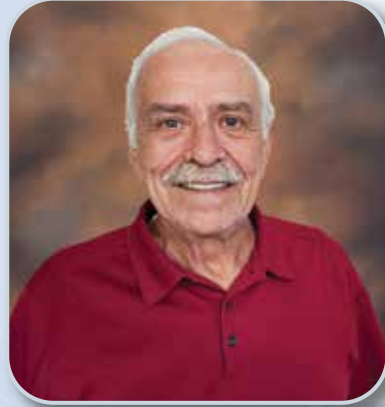

# Patient Testimonials



## Mark Peters – Patient Safety

"I spent a total of 29 days at Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) after being brought to the Emergency Department (ED) for a suspected ulcer and internal bleeding. I was admitted to the Hospital, and the staff performed an endoscopy and discovered that I did have an ulcer; however, it was not the source of my bleeding. Summiyah Nasir, M.D., ordered an X-ray of my lungs and discovered air in my abdomen. She then ordered a computed tomography (CT) scan and conferred with Victor F. Ferrini, M.D., of the LMH Surgery Department, to perform an exploratory surgery, which revealed that my spleen had ruptured and was the root cause of the internal bleeding. Had Dr. Nasir not discovered the air in my abdomen, I may have continued to bleed. After the surgery, I suffered a cardiac arrest. The ED and ICU cardiac team worked for 15 minutes to resuscitate me. They never gave up and saved my life. I was able to make a full recovery and have since visited the ICU several times to meet the men and women who saved my life and express my gratitude for their outstanding care."



## Russel "Rusty" Rine – Respiratory Care

"I was diagnosed with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). I visited Mohammad K. Islam, M.D., of Licking Memorial Pulmonology to create an action plan for treatment. I was smoking two packs of cigarettes a day, and Dr. Islam strongly encouraged me to quit smoking. I understood the health consequences of smoking, and I wanted to stay healthy for my grandchildren. I decided to participate in the LMH Quit for Your Health tobacco cessation program. I worked with Tobacco Treatment Specialist, Nia Spivey. She was very helpful, kind, and understanding, and she made the program enjoyable. I found that having the cessation aids, especially the lozenges, assisted the most in helping break my smoking habit. In addition to quitting smoking, I also participated in pulmonary rehabilitation to improve my lung function, reduce symptom severity, and improve my quality of life. Since quitting, my wife and I celebrated 54 years of marriage and I have been enjoying time with her, my children, my seven grandchildren, and two great grandchildren."

## Ronald "Bren" Henderson – Heart Care

"I love to coach and am the football and baseball coach for Licking Valley High School. One day during football camp, I experienced a racing sensation in my chest. I visited my physician and was given a heart monitor to wear. Following the monitoring period, I met with Eesha Maiodna, M.D., of Licking Memorial Cardiology, who explained that I had a heart arrhythmia. A few weeks went by, and my arrhythmia became more concerning. My heart felt like it was racing and I felt ill. I visited the LMH ED and stayed overnight for observation. Hassan Rajjoub, M.D., suggested that I was a good candidate for heart ablation, and I met with John Keller, M.D., of Licking Memorial Cardiac Electrophysiology. Dr. Keller took time to explain everything and made it very easy to understand the procedure, the benefits, and the possible side effects. His team was also very involved in the process, and they were kind and supportive. After my initial procedure, I was diagnosed with atrial fibrillation (AFib) and later underwent the first AFib ablation performed at LMH. I am so grateful for everyone who cared for me and am happy that I can continue coaching."



## Dakoda Dunlap – Emergency Care

"I had been taking an antibiotic for an illness for nine days, when I suddenly woke up with a rash on my arms and face. I attended school that day, but the rash worsened. The next morning, my throat felt swollen. My mom called my pediatrician, Richard Baltisberger, M.D., and the office staff advised that I go to the LMH ED. When we arrived at the ED, the registration process went quickly and smoothly, and everyone was kind, sympathetic, professional, and caring. We were only in the waiting room for about five minutes before being taken to triage, where we were then escorted to an exam room. The ED physician who examined me confirmed that I was having an allergic reaction to the antibiotic I was taking. I was treated with epinephrine and began feeling much better. The physician was personable and professional. He kept me informed about the treatment plan, as well as what to expect. The nurses all worked so well together as a team, placing patients first and foremost. LMH provided such a positive experience for me."



## Kathleen Michel – Maternity Care

"Even though I live nearer to a Columbus hospital, I knew it would be worth the travel to give birth to my first child at LMH. I feel a connection with LMH because my siblings and I were born there, and my mother worked in the Mother Baby unit. Since this was my first pregnancy, I wanted to learn everything I could about the growth and development of my unborn baby and the changes my body would go through. I participated in the Centering Pregnancy Program, which offers more personalized care for mothers-to-be. The program taught me so much about what to expect during pregnancy so that I could make informed choices about my own birthing experience. More importantly, I was able to build connections with other women. It was amazing to hear their stories, and we could all relate to one another, encourage each other, and talk about everything. I am still in contact with the other three women from the program. I would advise any mother to ask about the program and participate. I learned so much and I now have women in my life who I can lean on when I need encouragement."



## Carol Worst – Diabetes Care

"After I was diagnosed with prediabetes, I received a letter from Licking Memorial Health Systems informing me that I was eligible to participate in the free Diabetes Prevention Program – *Go Healthy!* I thought the accountability of the program was what I needed to make the lifestyle changes necessary to better my health and stop taking the medication, so I enrolled. The coaches were very knowledgeable and easy to talk to about the challenges of making lifestyle changes. They never judged or tried to make participants feel guilty about their habits. The material they covered during the classes was excellent. Every meeting, we were asked about our successes and failures, and that accountability was important for me to keep working to build the healthy habits. I learned to write down what I was consuming and when I exercised. Seeing the information on paper helped me to understand the idea of calorie intake versus output. The year-long process of the program was very beneficial. My blood sugar levels have dropped, I have lost weight, and my energy levels are up. I enjoy finding fun activities to keep me moving."

# Community Events

Throughout 2025, Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) employees and local residents were invited to events that celebrated LMHS' achievements and areas of growth. These events informed the community about the healthcare environment, communicated our appreciation to community members, and highlighted services. The events in 2025 included:

## Corporate Breakfast

The Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Council hosted three Corporate Breakfast events in 2025 to inform community leaders about LMHS' services and medical advances. The topics included a recap of 2024...The Year in Review and a Look Ahead to 2025, Recruiting and Maintaining a Strong Workforce, and Keeping Our Workplace Safe.

## Active Programs

In 2025, LMHS hosted five events as part of the Active•Fit Youth Wellness Program – Health & Fitness Fest, Junior Chef, Bowling, Ninja Warrior, and Summer Splash. During the Bowling event, participants bowled for two hours alongside participants of the Active•Senior Wellness Program. The Active•Senior Wellness Program also featured a number of events, including Yoga, Bingo, Dance, Celebration, Game Show, Brunch Walk, Pickleball, and Gourmet Gardener.

## Caregivers Expo

The LMH Development Council hosted the Caregivers Expo at LMH. More than 200 people attended the event to obtain information from area vendors with available resources that assist families who are caring for aging loved ones, and grandparents who are the primary caregivers for their grandchildren. The event featured 50 vendors, including care facilities, financial institutions, summer camps, and community organizations such as Big Brothers Big Sisters and the YMCA. Additional resources on mental health, family assistance, and healthy living were also available.

## LMHS Summer Camps

LMHS staff devoted their time over the summer to educate local youth about various health topics in fun, outdoor day camp settings. On June 6, Camp Feelin' Fine participants, ages 6 to 12, gathered to learn more about asthma, manage their symptoms, and interact with others who also have the condition. On July 8 and 9, high school seniors interested in pursuing a career in healthcare were invited to participate in Camp Med. The two-day event consisted of interactive demonstrations and discussions on a variety of healthcare topics. On July 15, LMHS hosted Camp Cool, which is to help youth, ages 6 to 12, explore mindfulness activities.

## “For Your Health” 5K Run/Walk & 1-mile Fun Walk

The 2025 “For Your Health” 5K Run/Walk & 1-mile Fun Walk was held on July 19. More than 1,300 residents from Licking County and Central Ohio registered for the 18th annual event. Honorary Chairs were Nancy and Jack Neely.

## Volunteer and TWIGS Recognitions

LMH hosted the annual Volunteer Recognition Dinner on April 8 and the TWIGS Recognition Dinner on May 1 to show gratitude to the individuals who regularly dedicate their time to benefit the Hospital. The 2025 Donald Day Volunteer of the Year Award recipient was Gary Morton. Volunteers delivered 36,487 newspapers, 230 cards and flowers, and completed over 322 messenger runs among other activities. In 2025, more than 241 Volunteers and TWIGS members devoted 30,733 hours serving the Hospital. Awards were presented to 11 TWIGS members celebrating milestone achievements. The TWIGS organizations provided over \$117,000 in donations to LMH in 2025.

## Cancer Survivors Picnic

Approximately 160 Licking County residents gathered on the grounds of the Licking Memorial Medical Campus on June 16 for the 14th annual Cancer Survivors Picnic. The event celebrated and honored cancer survivors for serving as an inspiration to individuals currently receiving cancer treatment. LMHS President & CEO Rob Montagnese recognized the attending cancer survivors and thanked family and friends for the continued support that they provide to loved ones during their cancer journey.

## Walk with a Doc

LMHS Active Medical Staff physicians were joined by community members as they enjoyed a walk at various locations in Licking County, including Rotary Park, Gellar Park, Infirmary Mound Park, Wildwood Park, COTC, Licking County Family YMCA, West Licking County YMCA, Oak Hill Manor, Karr Park, C-TEC, Johnstown-Monroe Middle School, and the Buckeye Lake Bike Path. During the walk events, the physicians led discussions on various topics, such as skin cancer and sun protection, asthma, colon cancer, mental health, diabetes, thyroid disease, managing Atrial Fibrillation (AFib), orthopedic shoulder injuries, Attention-deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), gynecological cancer awareness and screenings, and heart failure.

## Family Movie Night

On June 13, LMHS hosted a free Family Movie Night. More than 150 community members attended the event at the Pataskala Health Campus for an evening of active play on a variety of inflatable fun areas. Afterward, attendees enjoyed a viewing of Disney's Inside Out 2, on a 30 foot-high inflatable screen. Families were also provided healthy snacks and beverages at no cost to enjoy as they watched the movie.

## Be Wise...Immunize

In October, LMHS offered free influenza vaccines to Licking County infants and children. More than 240 youth, up to the age of 18, attended the “Be Wise ... Immunize” Youth Vaccination Clinics on October 11 at the Gerald K. McClain Building – Downtown Newark and on October 18 at the Licking Memorial Pediatrics – Pataskala. Staff members from Licking Memorial Pediatrics administered the vaccines after consulting with the children's parents.

## Lifetime Achievement Reception

Each year, the LMH Development Council hosts the Lifetime Achievement Reception to recognize those individuals whose actions provide a better quality of life for citizens of Licking County. On November 6, the 2025 Lifetime Achievement Award recipients, F. Jennifer Utrevis and Lou Mitchell (posthumously), were recognized for their dedication to their profession and continuing commitment to improve the health of the community. Created in 1989, the Lifetime Achievement Award is the highest honor that LMHS bestows each year. The 2025 Mary Jane McDonald Building a Healthier Community Award was presented to Licking County Transit. The organization was honored for removing the barrier of lack of transportation and improving the quality of life for those living in Licking County. Craig B. Cairns, M.D., M.P.H., and Bruce P. Miller, M.D., were honored with A Lifetime of Care recognition. The award was created in 2018 to honor physicians for their extended service to the Licking County community.

## Retiree Events

Each year, LMHS hosts two retiree events, the LMHS Retiree Luncheon and the LMHS Retiree Dinner. At these events, retirees are provided the opportunity to reconnect and share a meal at the Cherry Valley Hotel in Newark.

## Healthcare Expo

On Friday, March 7, LMHS sponsored the Healthcare Expo along with Central Ohio Technical College (COTC), and Career & Technology Education Centers of Licking County (C-TEC). The Expo featured information on educational courses and job opportunities in the healthcare industry, including Nursing, Radiology, Information Systems, Safety & Security, Culinary Services, Environmental Services, and more. Attendees had an opportunity to view simulations and demonstrations with various medical equipment and technologies.

## Community Education

“Healthier for Life” is a four-part program that was held twice on four consecutive weeks of 2025 in March and November. Attendees learned to successfully create consistent habits, including motivation, exercise, menu planning, disease management and prevention, and more. On Tuesday, February 12, Mallory Grieb, B.S.N., R.N., Quality Manager and Chest Pain Coordinator for Licking Memorial Cardiac Services discussed how a healthy diet can prevent heart disease. On Tuesday, April 8, Registered Respiratory Therapist Kenneth Justice, R.R.T., RRT-NPS, RRT-ACCS, AE-C, led an informative discussion on the diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of COPD. Living Well with Hearing Loss was held on Tuesday, June 10, with Cheryl Barker, Au.D., CCC-A, of Clear Choice Audiology, hosting a discussion on living well with the challenge of hearing loss and tinnitus, along with an additional discussion on August 12, about disorders of the inner ear and balance. On November 13, Brandon Wilson, APRN-CNP, of Licking Memorial Hospital Hematology/Oncology Clinic, discussed the correlation between alcohol use and cancer. Dining with Diabetes, a four-part course, held on October 2, 9, 16, and 23, educated individuals with diabetes and their families on healthy alternatives in food preparation.

## Pastoral Care Breakfast

Local religious leaders from Licking County were invited to LMH for a Pastoral Care Breakfast on Wednesday, May 21. D'Anna N. Mullins, M.D., Ph.D., of Licking Memorial Oncology, spoke to the group about how to support patients and families facing cancer.

## Employee Recognition

On the evening of May 13, LMHS congratulated employees on reaching milestones in service, and provided thanks for sharing their time and talents to help LMHS improve the health of the community. This event was held at the The John Gilbert Reese Center on the OSU-N/COTC Campus with a presentation of service recognition, activities, and drawings for prizes.

## Project SEARCH Graduation

For the past nine years, LMHS has hosted Project SEARCH for Licking County high school students who have completed the requirements for graduation, but remain enrolled as fifth-year seniors. The Project SEARCH High School Transition Program provides real-life work experience, combined with training in employability and independent living skills, to help youth with disabilities make successful transitions from school to adult life. The 2025 Project SEARCH Graduation was held on Wednesday, May 21, as a celebration and acknowledgment of the hard work and achievements of the students.

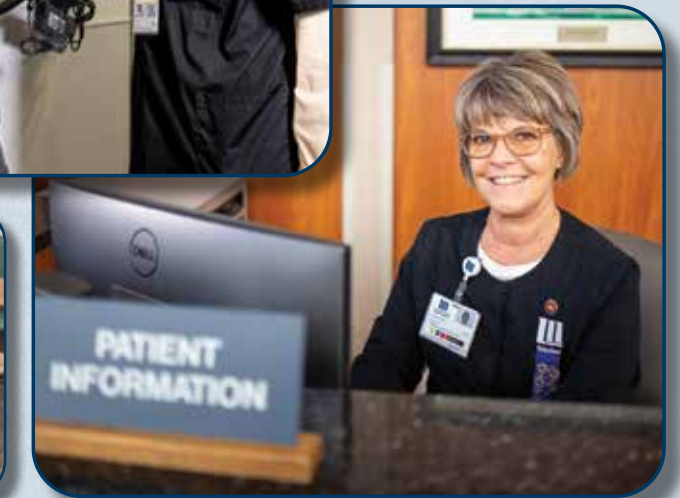
# TWIGS
